First Visit:

9th April 1947.

Went over to house which is a few yards from our house to see if Mr Watson would make a small table for us. He was out. Saw two small boys playing in the flower garden -- planting out forget me nots. Small girl near the Sugar mill chewing cane. Asked elder boy if I might speak to his mother. She came out. Said Mr W. was at his ground. So he is apparently farmer as well as carpenter. Asked her if she would ask him to call when he came in to see what I needed and whether he would do it. She said he had not had his dinner yet and would be coming back for it and she would give him the message. Was very pleasant and friendly. Volunteered that the house -- which I had admired -- was not yet finished but that they were poor, times were hard. And that she had a lot of children -- too many. I asked how many -- she said five but two were Mr Watson's. Is now pregnant.

House large with verandah. Flower garden in front. Adjoins the Brissett sugar mill. Obrebski informed that Watson owns house. If so, would appear that piece of land was bought from Mrs B. Watson did not come about the job. The Postmistress, Mrs Jones who met us outside as I was going away from his house, says he is a very busy man and that if we get him we must "nail him to it". May not have come because of B.? I remember she said yesterday that there were no good carpenters in Warsop and no one who would do anything -- so they may be at logger-heads.

Interview
J.O. & T.O.

Mr. Watson is not born in Warsop. He came here with his father about 30 years ago. "I was a little boy." His father lived previously to this in St. Ann, Stewart Town. He was the baker. He came here and rented bakery ~~xx~~ from Brissetts. Mr. Watson rents this bakery knows and he makes bread as his father did. He bakes bread twice a week: on Saturday and Thursday. He will bake bread probably also to-day instead of tomorrow in connection with the delivery of bananas to the government truck. He confirmed to practise two occupations: he is carpenter and the baker at the same time. But he does make little money.
