**The house**

Mr. Plummers house is between Wilmoth Town and the Main Road. Family History, and land.

"My father died when I was 14. I was the only son because I had two bastard brothers. I live with my mother and planted. She feel like marrying another husband and made division of land and I got 1½ acre. This was in 1931" The land he got was in Brown Town. This is adjoining to Green Town, nearer the road he bought another acre near this land. Later he bought 2 acres in the place where his present house is. Some of this land was from a brother and some from his sister who lives nearby. She was a Plummer Zorribel and married Harold Plummer who used to be a chauffeur for Mr. Webb. Both his brothers emigrated from Warsop, one lives in Manchester. Mr. Plummer is not in touch with them. Altogether he has 4½ acres in two pieces. On the land in Brown Town he cultivates cane only. He used to have banana there but they "die out". He has a boiling house there. On the land round his house he cultivates banana, yams, cocoe. Banana are yung, he doesnt know how many roots he has.

**The house.**

The house is a big one - three big rooms and verada. He built it 4 years ago. He says he never worked otherwise than on cultivation, hasnt been to USA. "God helped me and I was lucky". He accumulated lumber for building house for a long time, and little by little.

**Children.**

Mr. Plummer has 10 children. 4 go to school. "one (the fifth one) I had to stop things going stiff. Children are clad neatly, all younger ones in the same kind of blue material which is the cheapest, but their clothes are clean and not torn. They smile and are friendly. On the table among religious literature are their copybooks. In the old ones some drawings. I acquired one of them (copybook with drawings).

**"spiritual" life.**

Mr. Plummer is a Seventh day adventist. Big posters in his hall, weeklies etc. on the table - are all adventists publications. "I was converted in 1936, after I married. I was rude and violent, I smoke and gamble until I was fed up with such a life. I pray and search the scripture. I learn I must keep commandments. I find the Sabbath make trouble. If I was saved I must observe all commandments. I read the Bible and found Sabbath is really on Saturday. This is true. Brother Ruddy helped me. He was adventist in foreign land and in Manchester. Reckless life

doesn't pay. I try to be good. Just go on thinking. He (God) prepare great things for us."

There are some Adventists in Bottom Warsop: Stephen White, two Blacks, Mrs. Farguasson. Their church is in Troy. They go there on Saturdays. Mr. Plummer doesn't go to market on Saturday - he keeps the Sabbath strictly. The family works on Sundays.

Opinion about Revivalists.

There are two revivalist churches in Wilmouth Town. Mr. Plummer doesn't approve of this sect. "God likes meek and humble - no jumping, fighting, growling. It come plenty idleness - they kept meetings on Mondays. People came all over the place and other watch them. The Government stopped it. Plenty of idleness. They jumped and chocked. You don't find intelligent folks go to them - mostly illiterate."
