Informant: Cecilia Green.

Cecilia Green is sister of Sylvester and Oswald Green. Lionel Green /now dead/ was also her brother. Her mother is Jane Green / 23/20/30/. Jane Green ~~was~~ ~~sister~~ and the mother of Reuben Facey / the deceased husband of Mrs Ida Facey / were two sisters.

Daniel Rose is from Black River but he came "long ago" to Warsop. They live in a grass hut between George Wiltshire and Jimmy Edwards. They rent the hut and one stretch from George Wiltshire. They also work for him. Cecilia Green weeds the grass for Wiltshire. She gets sometimes 2/6 "for the job". Such a job takes her sometimes a week and sometimes 3 days. /She does not work all the day/. They rent also half an acre from Sylvester Brissett. The rent for it is one pound for the year. Plant there "a little yam". Their hut is small but in good repair. There is no kitchen. Cecilia Green cooks on some stones in front of her house. "Wiltshire him kind". They do not rent land in All Sides. "You pay rent and next day you owe it again". /It is paid quarterly/. To Brissett they pay once a year. Cecilia is very small and her feet are crooked.

~~Mr~~ Cecilia Green had one child. She use to go to school but had fits. They would take her in the middle of the road. She would run away and Cecilia had to look for her in the bushes. "Give it to government" She is now since 5 years in the asylum in Walmouth. Cecilia goes sometimes to see her. She was there last year, but the daughter is no better. They care well for them. She is about 18, a big woman.

To-day's occupations. Rose went to work on his rent land /from Brissett/. Cecilia went to see her mother. She is ill. "She can't go out to see the son" /The son Sylvester who is ill/. Now Cecilia came to see her ill brother Sivester. Mrs Ida Facey who came also to see him asked her to pick some guava leaves for her. Cecilia was picking them on the parochial road. "It is good. I can't tell you exactly for what, but it is good to drink".
