Informant 2

Emanuel Powell died recently. He was a very active man, representing Bull Savannah growers at the board of directors. Had all sorts of businesses. His name is engraved on many houses in Bull Savannah which he built. It is believed that because of his "wreckless life" a jealous woman poisoned him in Christiana. Altogether it was Obeah.

The house is ~~xxxxxxx~~ at the bottom of Green Olive valley at its north-east end. It is the "old family house" It has been built by the founder of the Powell family Joseph Powell. It was built more than 100 years ago because "George Powell who is 96 now was born there and he was not the oldest son". The house is beautiful with a nicely pleated thatch (renovated 14 years ago). Originally all windows were shutters, lately some were converted into windows with glass panels. The floor is made of boards of a bullit tree which used to grow near the place. It was such an ~~enormous~~ enormous tree that floors for two houses were made out of it. From a "limb" a mortar to beat castor oil (an important product in the region in older days) was made. It still exists though children chopped a lot of it.

A very big catchment and tank was built also ~~at~~ at the time when the house was built. The tank was made - as all in those days and some even to-day - from lime mixed with earth and beaten so long till it got a "face". It would keep water "wonderfully". However some years ago it had to be repaired and was made with cement.

The kitchen is more recent, as the old one was destroyed by a hurricane.

Under a very big and thick mango tree some 50 yards from the house are the family graves: old Joseph Powell, his wife (a Rochester - sister of Thomas Rochester senior) a daughter. A bit apart the recent grave of Emanuel Powell and another person. On the old ones the inscriptions are not ~~xxxxxxxx~~ legible.

We were invited there in company together with Ernest Powell (brother of Turnica and Edith) & Mr. Andrewa. Turnica and Edith did not sit at the table. The honours were performed by the young Johnson (Isaac Johnsons son), whose trunk obviously from the american trip was in the next room with his name written on it. Young Johnson sat at the table, said the grace and looked after the guests. Some men (older than Johnson) were sitting under the walls and participating in the conversation but not partaking of the meal. The two sisters looked after the food.

There are three rooms in the house, The middle one - the guest-dining room, and at the two ends two bed rooms with colossal ~~xxx~~ old fashioned beds with posts (but without baldachim) in them. The ladies invited me to wash hands in a bed room. On a dressing table a lot of vanishing and other ~~xxxxxxx~~ cosmetic cream jugs were displayed.

I understand that Emanuels son Denzil is at present on contract in the USA and his other son Ernest lives in a house next to this one. What happened to Stanford and what is the place of the young Johnson in the household I dont know yet. At the time of the census young Johnson was in the USA.

I visited again Misses Edith and Turnica and they came twice to visit us. Young Johnson is the son of Turnica and Isaac Johnson. Denzil Powell is at home. He is one of the party in the "cow case" (see Village Life No 4 p.1. and No 5 pp 4 and 5)

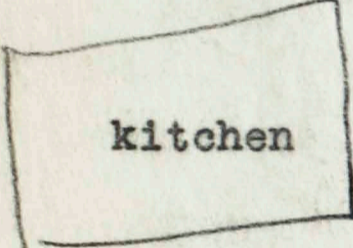
I went one morning to the Powell house and found Miss Turnica and a little 3 years old boy. Miss Turnica explained that his name is Maurice. He is the son of her late brother Emanuel. The mother was "on the dark side". She was not a wedded wife of Emanuels. She was from Spanish Town. Stayed for some time in Bull Savannah - manuel brought her to his home, but she returned to Spanish town. Why didnt she stay? "She wasnt the type" said Miss Turnica ~~expressing~~ in a tone conveying moral disapproval to the woman. Turnica took care of the boy since he was 1 year old. She promised to her brother to look after this child. I said I wanted to take a picture of the house (it is one of the oldest and most beautiful in the village) of herself and the little boy. Miss Turnica asked me to wait a little. She changed her dress and did her hair. Then the little boy who was running about in a short shirt and barefoot was sent to wash. He was washed thouthoughly in a cedar bowl under the mango tree. Then Miss Turnica started to dress him.

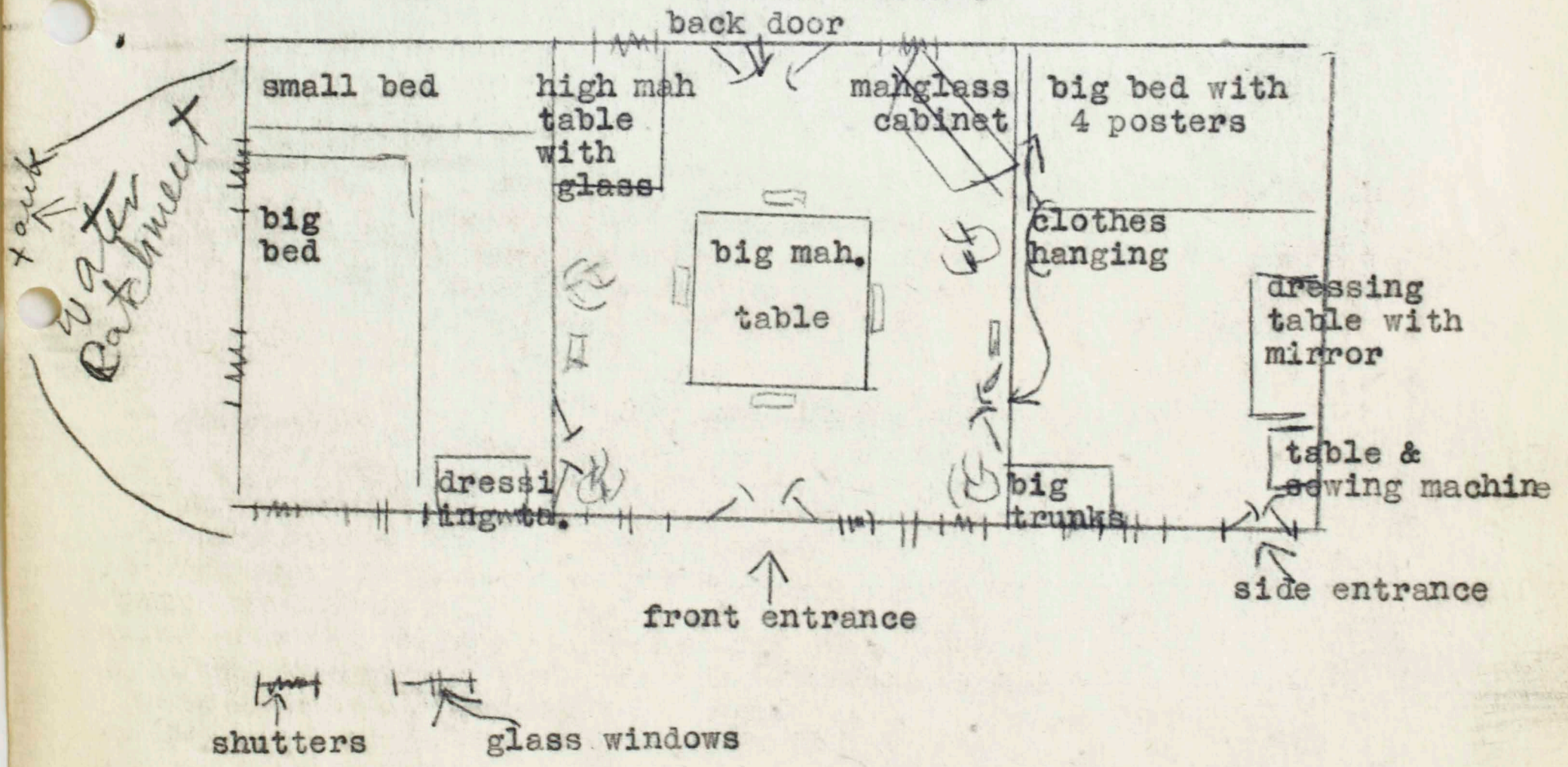

I learned that the bright yellow socks and new shoes were a present from his mother in Spanish Town. The beautiful embroidered blue suit was made by Turnica herself. The child could hardly walk in his stiff new shoes. Then his hair was combed and Miss Turnica applied generously with a puff white powder on his face. (The child is "on the dark side" after his mother)

Waiting for these ceremonies being achieved I made a plan ~~and inventory of the furniture~~ of the rooms and inventory of the furniture. The rooms are clean, tidy and convey an impression of "stately" wellbeing. The type and arrangement of furniture is typical of well to do houses in Bull Savannah. It is the type of families who aspire (the more successful members) to middle class standards. Miss Turnica chatted about servants. "It is hard - even to get a servant to do domestics work. You have to do your work yourself" (It must have been a kind of apology as on a previous occasion of unexpected visit I found her washing) She said Miss Jude lost her servant because she (Miss Jude) didnt look properly after the girl. "But I dont blame her - those servants they dont know a thing" But Miss Turnica didnt keep in the role of a middle class employer long. "here are so many unemployed people in Jamaica - you have to try to make your own employment here to live" - this was refering to tomato growing. She has

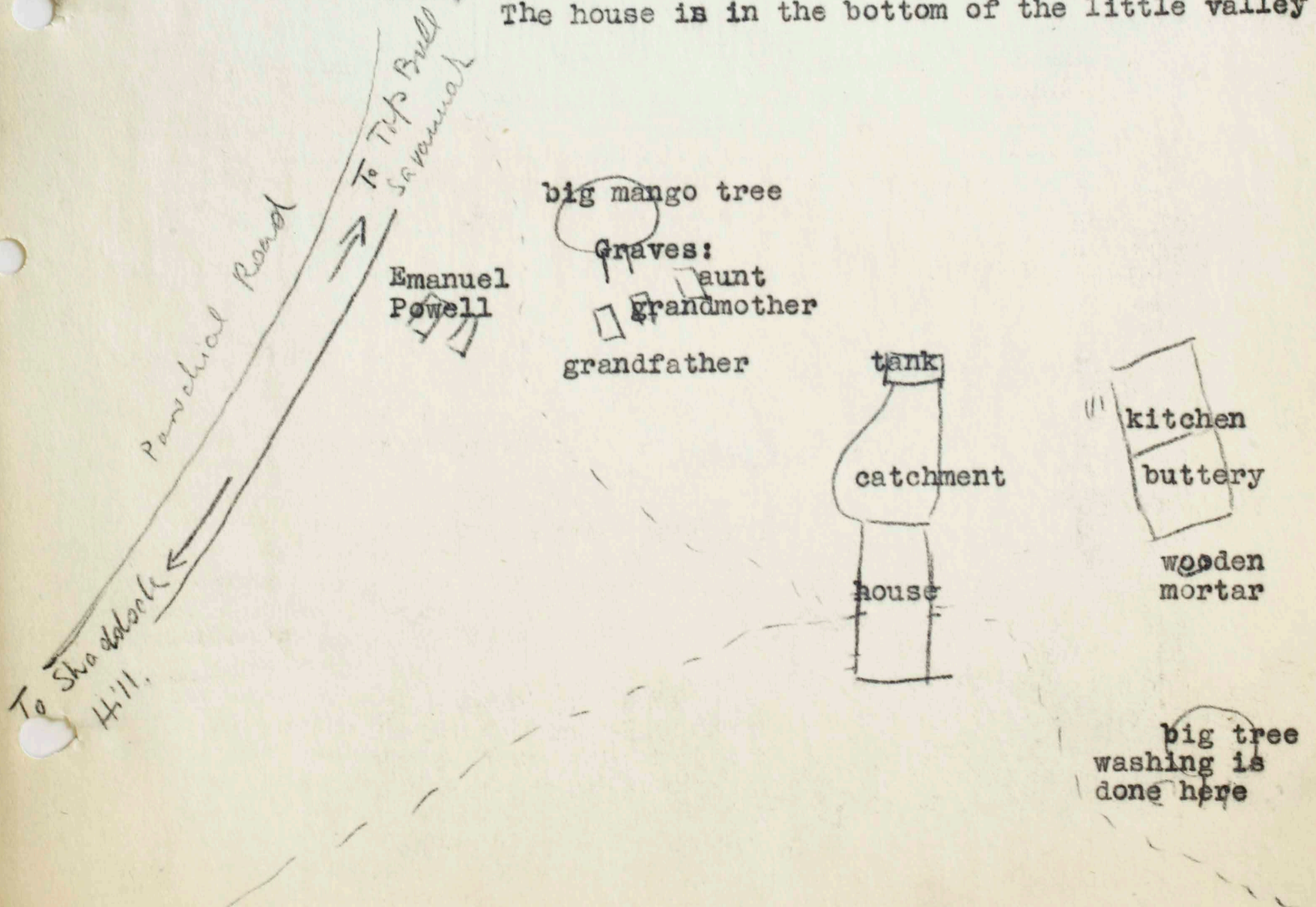


The floor is polished made of bullit tree boards. There is no ceiling - neat and beautiful thatch work could be seen - artistic piece of handicraft. On the glass cabinet pictures of "american" relatives (cousins) ~~Na~~
The catchment is very big - width of the house, but longer than the house.

I couldnt get who exactly lives at pbsent in the house. I understand however that the first (from left on the plan) room - is young mens bed room. It con-
~~tainxvtwixx~~ contains two beds, one smaller and one double and a table which serves as as "toilette".

In the hall there is one big square mahogany table in the middle with a pot with ~~flowers~~ flowers. On the side table (exactly like the one at Uncels ^{KeanyP}) ~~gla~~ stand glasses. The glass mahogany cabinet in the corner contains cups , china but not of everyday use. There are 2 rocking arm chairs, and 8 chairs. The last room is the bed room of the two sisters - probably the little ^Maurice sleeps there too. On the table there are many bottles and jars with cosmetics Cold cream, Vanishing cream, powder etc. Clothes hang on the wall behind the bed and on the door leading to the hall. In a corner a big black "american" trunk with Johnsons name in white letters. It is the type which the "american farm labour" bring usually. On it some other trunks and suit cases. A hand sewing machine (Singer) under the small table. Some washed but not pressed clothes in a big wooden bowl under the four posters bed. No chest of drawers and no wardrobe.

The house is in the bottom of the little valley

One is old family house /the plan of which is on p.4/. ~~Another~~ Another is a new house /cottage with verndah/ built by Denzil Powell from American money. Denzil Powell stays still in America. He built this house to settle down after coming back from abroad.

The third house is on the other side of the centra path through Green Olive. It is ~~situated~~ situated close to Annelaa Powell's house. The house belongs to Stanford Powell, ~~brother~~ brother of late Emanuel.

Stanford is a single man. He never married. Has no woman with him and no children. Herents his house to Cecil Miller, Cecil Miller is a ~~motor~~ chauffeur of his truck. Cecil Miller lives in this house with his wife Estha /nee Thompson/, Philip Thompson's daughter.

Cecil Miller and his family.

"Chauffeur Cecil Miller - he lives in Stanford's house. Cecil Miller has a wife - Estha Thompson, Philip ~~Thompson~~ Thompson daughter. She is Miller now - them marry."

Miller was a stranger in Bull Savannah. "He met first time his wife around 1942-43 - still in Major Moxsy time. Miller was driving bread from Balaclava to Bull Savannah. Miller and the said woman met. And them went to Balaclava to live."

"Him loose the job in Balaclava, took his wife from Balaclava to Prospect, where he is from."

"Miller and his wife - them living not nicely when they were in Prospect. So him wife leave him and come back to Bull Savannah. They couldnt manage and they get a little part up."

"Esta Thompson - she stay with Philip Thompson when she come back. Miller visit him wife afting from Prospect. Him living down in Prospect all the time. In September Powell met him and took him a driver. Him settled down in Bull Savannah for a period of time. In coming, visiting him wife him succeeded job in Bull Savannah."

"Them have one child - around 3 years old."

Family history.

Leon, Nancy /called also Turnieca/ and Edith are full brothers and sisters. Their father was Isaac Powell, their mother Frederica Powell. It was common law marriage - they never married. They had another brother, Emmanuel, who died in 1947. Emmanuel was the head of the family before he died.

Nancy Powell.

Nancy is not married. She had 6 children for Isaac Johnson but never shared home with him. Only two of this children are alive: Leo and Curl. They stay with their mother's home, but Leo works spends days at his father's where he has his workshop. He is a cabinet maker. Cf. Family Record 24. Curl goes to school - she is in 4th stand.

Edith Powell.

Edith Powell never married. She has no children. Keeps a shop rented from Arthur Lewis.

Leon Powell.

Leon Powell did not marry and has no girl friend. He was in friendship with Wilhel Simpson, daughter of Rosa Powell and Frederic Simpson from Shaddock Hill. Rosa Powell is ~~xxxx~~ daughter of old George Powell. The child that Rosa had for him died.

Ernest Powell

Ernest is the son of Emmanuel Powell (dec. brother of Leon) and Ellen Powell. His father died last summer. His mother is alive, and lives in Ridge. Ernest was brought up in his father's home

Denzil Powell

Son of Emmanuel Powell and Dover from Santa Cruz. For half brothers and sisters on father's side see above. He has about 3 half brothers and sisters on his mother's side. He maintains family relationship with them and visits them from time to time.

Denzil is not married. Has no children (?)

Leo and Curl Johnson see Nancy Powell.

Brought up in mother's home.

Powell Maurice.

Maurice is the son of Emmanuel (dead) and Agatha Holness from Downs. Agatha lives at present in Spanish Town. Maurice is brought up by his aunt Nancy.

Maurice has half brothers and sisters only on his father's side (see above)

His mother sends him sometimes clothes.

Emigration

Leon Powell went to Cuba once in 1920. It is not known whether he brought any savings from Cuba.

Ernest Powell went to the United States twice: in 1945 and 1946. He brought some savings which he invested in cultivations.

Leo Johnson went to the United States once in 1946. For his savings he bought some carpenter tools.

Housing

Yams: 300 hills are planted by Leon and Ernest for home use only.

Cassava: about 3 acres are planted for home use.

Gungoo peas: 5 acres for home use.

Corn: a little is planted for own use.

Red peas: for home use about 1/2 acre.

Sweet potatoes - about 3 to 4 square chains.

No escallion, cabbages or other vegetables are planted.

Live animals.

There are 2 donkeys, 2 milch cows, 2 steers, 2 calves (one heifer and one bullkin) The cattle is kept in Spring Pastures, ~~xxxxxxx~~ which belong to Jamaica Vegetables. The Powells pays the Company for the upkeep of their cattle.

There are 3 pigs, but no other small stock. 15 hens, some Leghorn and some Plymouth. Eggs are used only for home consumption.

~~Religion~~

Nobody in this ~~fx~~ household does fishing.

Occupations and trades.

Leo Johnson is a cabinet maker. He started to practice this trade only a few months ago.

Edith Powell keeps a shop.

Denzil is truckowner and driver.

Expenditure.

This households spends weekly on the average for food bought in shop and cleaning about 12/-. The items bought in the shop are mostly: rice, salt, sugar, a little flour, meat at the butchers, fish, matches, kerosene oil.

The ~~six~~ expenses for clothing are estimated for a year: about £ 16 per person for women, and about £30 per person for men. For children of both sexes about £7 is spent on clothes yearly.

A certain amount of money is spent on school books for children.

There was no expenditure for health during last year, as nobody was ill in the family. Emmanuel died suddenly last August. About £30 was spent on his funeral.

For entertaining about £ 10 was spent ~~xxxxxxx~~ in Christmas time.

Savings and Investments.

Savings are kept by all the members of the family in the bank. Leon Powell has in the bank about £ 150

Conversation with Ernest Powell.

I met Ernest at the house of Preston Ford. He arrived in a lorry with about five other men, and began to dig at some stones in the yard. He called me over and said he wanted to talk to me.

First of all he wanted to know why he had been left out, of all this questioning business. He had a feeling that it was no accident that ~~xx~~ this had hap ened. He persohally knew all the staff of the Survey, ~~xxxxx~~ scarcely a day went by when he did not see Mr Fisher, and he had also seen the Doctor. Why then had he not been interviewed?

I said I was unable to fairly answer that as I had been her too short a time. He then demanded why we were picking out some houses and leaving others. He knew many, many houses that we had not been near. Did we really intend to see every household in Bull Savannah? If we did why were certain people being excepted from our investigation.? On being asked who he was thinking of in particular, the frist person he named was Mr Hastings. The second person was Mr Millard the teacher. I ask d him how he knew that ~~x~~ neither of the these people had been interviewed? Had he asked them personally? He said no, but that he was sure we had not been to either of them. On being further pressed he said that he could not give me any more names for the moment, but he knew them alright.

Those questions, he continued. Really Miss Hall, I am sure you would not find it possibl to answer them. If I was in your position and put some of the questions to you I am sure you would not be able to reply to me, Miss Hall. Those questions are impossible to answer.

He demanded that I should call and give him a proper interview.. I said that as he knew ~~xxxxxxx~~ E.F. I would ask him to call down and see him. This he refused. "Can't you come and see me? Can't you ask as many questions as E.F.?... Well then, I would rather talk to you."

He was anxious to know if I knew his house, and where to find him.

Women and children of late Emmanuel Powell.

"Uncle Manu - he was really a great man. Loveable man. Everybody love him. Had lot of children. He was a man that never failed to put a question. Some call him Uncle Manu, some - Uncle Mish, some - Chin: he had big chin. He was light, but some of his children black. Ernest Powell - black. Denzil even blacker. His mother was a girl a teacher had ~~xxx~~ with him. They fall and Denzil was by her."

"Denzil mother was working with one school master here by name of Miss Wint. Well, she and Manu get in company then. Manu give her a son - Denzil. It happen ~~thx~~ that Emanule did'nt want a child at first. But the girl carry the child come and look for the grandparents. And the grandparents find it that it ~~ix~~ was Emmanuel's child. So they took it from her, then adopt it then. That the way ~~that~~ the boy come ahead of his father - took all his father belonging."

"Ernest. Emanuel and Ernest mother wasnt in friendship. But at that time Ellen Powell /who is Ernest mother/ - she was along with one David Simpson at that time. It happen that Emmanuel break through and give her Ernest. But him /Emmanuel/ never own him /Ernest/ - until hik become a big man. Because Emmanuel's brother, Stanford, he seed that the boy is really for Emmanuel and he take the boy home. And from that now the boy still living there. He was a boy, he was around 14 to 15 /when he was taken by Stanford/. Big boy. He ~~xxx~~ was a man at that time. Why Stanford took Emanuale's child? It Stanford brother child and Stanford see that the boy ~~xxxxxxx~~ does'nt get ~~xxxxxxx~~ much care. So he take him home down there and give him land to work. It happen that him get away to America twice and make himself better than him was."

Another outside child of Emmanuel: Lila Powell, by Violet Powell in Alligator Pond. "One girl - she is a big woman now. Her mother was from Alligator Pond, Violet Powell. That girl name Lilla Powell, daughter of Emmanuel. Living now in Alligator Pond. Since she come big woman she owned by Emmanuel, but when she was a child, never owned. Emmanuel refused."

"Emmanuel went to a dance in Alligator Pond and met Violet Powell. It happen that he give her ~~thax~~ this child that time. It was no friendship terms, so him never own that child at first. Until she turn big woman before he own her. But she dont get any land /after Emanuel's death/. If Emmanuel didnt get as he die, she might get something. Just the children that are around him in the home - that get anything."

"Next child - Travers Powell. Mother was Amy Dyer, but now she is Amy Neil. She and Manu were in friendship first - for a period of time. It happen that he give her Travers Powell. And it happen that he really didnt own him first. He said it was for a next man. Until the boy come good size boy that show his family - then he own him. That boy is in America now."

"Again next child - Glenrick Powell. Mother was Rose Dyer at first. They were in friendship. He was visiting Mr. Charles Dyer house and the girl footen / = consent / to give him privilege to visit the home. Father and mother did ~~no~~ know about it. Is the girl that marry to Jonathan Holness / of Comma Pen /. It happen that she make a baby for him / Emmanuel /. Mr. Dyer said that if he cant marry Rose Dyer then he must find a house to put her. After the parents find that she is going to have a baby for Emmanuel Powell, them ssaïd they wouldnt tolerate her, Emmanuel Powell must response for her."

"Emmanuel was building a house at the tãme, but the house didnt finish. So him beg the parents - the girl parents - to keep the girl till him finish the house. The parents keep the girl and she have the baby in her parents home. She and Emmanuel still continue friendship. Emmanuel give her a next baby, but that one die. Then the girl find that Emmanuel wasnt to do any good for her. So she just leave Emmanuel and take Jonathan Holness. Grandparents Dyer have the boy - Glenrick his name."

"Him have next child by one Alberga Elliott. She ~~wa~~ was the daughter of Sarah Powell and old Aron Elliott. He was in friendship with that girl. Long time. Promise to marry her. But before he marry the girl make the baby for him and ~~that~~ that spoil the joke. It happen that he take the girl in his hpuse - his father was no more alive. The girl have the baby in his house. He didnt count him / = her / again, the love - him wasnt so strcag ag again for the girl. Every night him leave the girl and gone to a next girl friend. Which one? Dont know: it was so much / = many / I just dont know. At that time he was along with Gatty Holness. She / Gatty Holness / is not from Bull Savannah, she come from Leititz. She was living in Manu house after a while. But at that time she was living in Mandeville. When Emmanuel ~~wasnt~~ was not giving good treatment to Alberga ~~Russ~~ Elliott, at that time Gatty Holness was living in Mandeville."

"Alberga - she couldnt put up with the treatment. Give up and go to live in her mother home. With the baby. A next man from Comma Pen marry her and adopt the baby also. She is now living in Comma Pen."

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"Him have next child by Miss Jude sister - Vie. Well, this girl was the married woman. But it happen that she and her husband part. And Manue was in frienshi with her even before she marry. She leave Emmanuel and live with Luther Nembhardt. Both of them couldnt agree after marry. So she leave her husband and come back to her father and mother home."

"Emmanuel start to visit her back. She make a baby for Emmanuel. At first Emmanuel didnt own the baby and him couldnt own either. If he did own it then the gurl husband could take him to court. After a while him own it - in the quiet. Give him support - but every body know it." ~~This is the story of the baby for him. He took her home from Mandeville. She was there until she have a baby. Emmanuel fell in love again, withdraw the love from Gatty. The girl find that him doesnt care for him/her, leave and go to Spanish Town. Two sister of Emmanuel adopt the baby. Gatty Holness - she was a black woman.~~

"He leave out Violet /Vie/ to go to this woman Gatty then. She make a baby for him - he took her home then - from Mandeville. She was there until she have a baby. Emmanuel fell in love again, withdraw the love /from Gatty/. The girl find that him doesnt care for him /her/, leave and go to Spanish Town. Two sister /of Emmanuel/ adopt the baby. Gatty Holness - she was a black woman."

"Manue was also in friendship with one girl - old Aaron Rochester daughter: Burdell. He was in friend ship for a year or so, but she never make a baby for him. A next man from Ballard's Valley - Elliott - come in the midst and took her away from Manu and marry /her./to"

"Him next have a girl - the last one - and him dead. This Hazel Roach that living in his house now. He and Hazel was in frienship. He promised to marry her to Hazel. But it happen that before he could marry, death come in the midst and separate them."

Would he marry her if he were alive? "O nothing like that, nothing like that! He was a mouth man and he was good looking chap. And his possession was good to all - the girl just gerrying after him. Powells - those people dont giving to marry. Old father and mother never marry. Emmanuel - never marry. Uncle Peny - never marry. James - never marry. He marry - he marry in Ame-rica and he died."
