How the family is supported? Contributions of the family memebres.

"Everybody try to help each other in the family." His mother's household is constituted of 4 persons Alma Simpson, her daughter and Dudley 's sister: Ellenn Simpson, and two sons of Ellenn: Riccardo and Herbert. They figure in the census as "Simpsons", but only Herbert is Simpson. Ricardo's father is a Nemhardt.

Alma Simpson's household is separate from thairx man those of their sons: Enoch and Qudley. But both sons help the mother. She owns a pice of land over 2 acres and the xixxwarked but the land is uncultivated. It is under grass. Only a small portion is cultivated by Ricardo.

"The land occupy two acre and some preches. Around two acre. Uncultivated. Only Ricardo work a little bit. Not much. She keep it for raising few goats. She have a ewe with two kids, two big wether goats - the goat

that we castrate we call it wether goat."

An important source of their income is thatch.

"The thatch that she have on her land - this support her. I never count the trees, but whenever they cut it it is 6 to 7 hundreds, 8 shillings per hundred.

And she have a little pimento. Very few have it. They had lots of pimento, but the storm of 1933 blow them - lots."

"Ricardo is the chief cultivator in the family.

"Ricardo - him plant keem tomato, yam, potato, a little cassava, a little gungoo peas, - all of them is not much."

All Alma's children contribute to the upkeep of this family, chiefly to the upkeep of their mother.

"Everyone of his sons and daughters support him /= her/." "My mother get support from my brother Enoch, and she get support from her daughter Iva Dyer - that living in Chocolate Hole. And she get support from me. I work to support my mother. And she get a little support from the one in America too. From one to-day

to another she will live."

"Her daughter Elleen - she do the cooking. She cook at the morning time and she cook at the evening time, when she come back from the factory. She work in the factory every day. She work not in the ms evening. And she get - my mother - she get tea, breakfast and dinner from my home. And she get meals from my brothers home. Every meal she have to get. Every meal I send to my mother. My little son or my little daughter carry it and sometime her little grandson /Nerbert/ have to come for it. Iva Dyer - she send meal, but not often. She keep a shop, so she send a little storage at the time, so shex/mxxmathurk can keep her. Everybody try to help each other in the family."

Ricardo's work.

Ricardo works from time to time with Dudley, helping him with his cultivations. Dudley does not pay his
nephew with money - he gives him food and from time
to time a gift of money - when the tomatoes delivered
to the factory are paid. But he lives and feeds in
Dudley's mother's home. "Him live xwax in my mother's
home, and him feed in my mother home, but I have waip
to help with that part too."

"My sister work for himself - she work at the factory to earn for herself and Ricardo work in the factory for himself. Day after day they work. My sister earning 2/- per day - quite poor, but it is. And Ricardo earning 3/- per day."

"She work under the shed - separating the bad tome toms from the good one and picking forthe cannery fruit. Ricardo work in the packing house - moving the box as the

the girls wrap it."

"They start from the crop start. In January. They work everyday. Some day they miss - mostly Sunday day, and some Sunday they work."

Elleen's famt life history. The first man she was along. First child.

Dudley is not quite sure what is his sister's age. He gave it 28 or so. /in the C. she is 32 in 1942/.

Ellewn's first child was Ricardo, whom she born for Felix Nemhardt. "Ricardo - the elder - is Nemhardt. His father is Felix Nemhardt. Him is alive, but he not in

in Bull Savannah. He is away in Vere. Him work at the estate. He is from Comma Pen. Long ago since he leave - when Ricardo was a small little boy. Once he pay visit to Bull Savannah - it was long ago. Him sent the little for the boy, but not much. I was the whole supporter -

yes, sir."

Present household :

Simpson Ellen head F.S./4.4. Bull.Sav. R.W. higgler Ricardo son M.S. 17 odd jobs at school

I came to her house just a few minutes after Ellen came from Alligator Pond with a headload of fish. She sold some to neighbour's children who came to buy it. Then she went to the kitchen a started to make fire to prepare supper.

Her mother Alma Simpson died a months ago and Ellen is living now alone with her two sons. he showed me her house. It is a small one-room house. There she sleeps with her younger son Herbert. There is opposite another one-room house. There her elder son Ricardo sleeps with his cousin (Enoch's son) Eudley.

For Ellen's parents etc. see Fam. Rec. of her bro-

thers: 6 & 62.

Ellen has four sons: the two who stay with her are for Eucal Simpson. He doesn't help Ricardo "since him big", helps a little Herbert, but not much. Her youngest son is Headley Sinclair. He stays with his father James Sinclair in Ribbit Town. Headley is about 8 years old. She has another son Ashburn Nembhard. This was for Felix Nembhard. The boy stayed with the father but "his father didn't care him nice" so "a gentleman took him and he stays with him in Clarendon." Ashburn is about 15.

Ellen says "icardo is lazy and runs about and doesn't help her much. We were in the tiny kitchen made (roof-and walls) of thatch. he showed me a low bench made of sticks and said that was the place where her mother used to sit. She always put something soft to sit on. Her own son Herbert and about half a dozen of her brother's children came to listen to our conversation. I couldn't get rid of them. About her love affairs Ellen just said "Foolishness" and "It's the woman who has the hard end". She stayed for a time with James Sinclair in Ribbit Town. I don't know why they parted.

All the time we were talking she would send her brother's children to do for her some little errand. A small girl Joyce was sent to the shop, Icyline to bring a bucket of water from the tank, Sadley to bring some wood. "We live together" she explained to me and the three households: Ellen's, Enoch's and "udley's are really in one yard. The three households form like a triangle: at the top isx they house work with the way are the two small houses of Ellen and her kitchen. The explained that the house she lives in was really built by Dudley. But wax since his brother Burnel died Dudley "succeed to his house" and this one was left for the mother and sister. The other small house where her

son sleeps was built by her mother after the old house collapsed. At one end is the house and kitchen which belong to Enoch, and at the other lower end the house end kitchen of Dudley. In the middle of the triangle is a catchment and tank which is used by Judley and Ellen. Enoch has his own tank. The 9 children of Enoch, 4 of Dudley and her own 2 boys are "all about the place". They treat each home as their own and render little services to their resp. uncles and aunts.
