Ancestry.

His mother was Mary Sinclair, and hismaternal grandmother from Elliott family from Ballards

"Her people (grandmother's) were white people and as fair as you." "She was from Bal. Valley and

I married a girl from B. Val. too."

Mrs. Eurcella Dyer is from Ballards Valley Her maiden name was Banton. She says she married and came to live here 37 years ago.

The land, & house.

Mr. Charles Dyer's father house is on the other side of B. Sav "over the Ridge". His father and motherare dead. Two of his brothers settled on the old paternal land.

The house in which Mr. Charles Dyer lives now with his family was built by himself. The land round it was bought from his mother and two sisters. "It was my mother's claim".

Before he married he spent 17 years in Alligator Pond.

"I spent there 17 years - near Alligator Pond. I cultivate there, I raise horses and cattle I fish in the river".

He didnt have land there, he workedv x was living on Spring Pastures.

"I drink water from the river but malaria never trouble me. I take quinine twice weekly, it is the best."

Visit of daughter.

One of their daughters is married to Holness. They live in Letitz Savannah. The daughter, her husband and their two children came on a visit to-day to Mr. & Mrs. Dyer. They intent to spent a couple of days in B. Savannnah.

Mr. Dyer said he wanted to visit us and he promised to come to-morrow evening.

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The conversation turned to war. Mr. yer hates the Germans.

"We heard here how they took advantage of other people. They lost. They will never rise, never reunite again. They are under american and british flag. Everybody under british flag must have a far share."

I expressed the hope that Germans like Swedes after the period of wars will watthextexx may be become peaceful democratic nation.

Mr. Dyer was full of admiration for the democratic Swedes but his sentiments towards the Germans were revengeful.

"They will never rise again" he repeated many times.

Mr. Senior is a fervent supporter of the Seven Day Adventist and is a wenchervefixthekexekereby leader and member in their church.

Visit of Mr. Charles Dyer 18.3.48. T.O. & J.O.

> Mr. Byer came - as promised - shortly before 7 p.m. We were just having supper and he shared it with us.

Asked whether he would drink some rum he said "I drink anything". (He is the founder of 7 Day Adven. congregation in B. Sav.)

After the supper the others (E.F. I.D.D.B.)
left and Mr. Byer sat with us helping himself generously all the time with rum. He started by expressing his regrets and apddogies that he came to visit us only now. He spoke slowly to enable us to take notes, and we were able to make a verbatim record.

"You are/stranger . Come to live with us and we are so happy to have you. The first time I saw you - passing my gate one afternoon - wet. I was so in sympathy. Saw you wet and could give you a shel-

ter, but at that time you pass my gate and you was near to your house. Simple because we love to accomodate poor strangers" (He wanted to ask us in though he didnt - why is explained later).

"The second time I saw you it was at the fac-

trangers in the village

(I was)

tory gate early morning. Standing in front of the gate- you were coming from the factory . In the evening while I was returning from work I came to the Elliott spirit lincenced shop. I saw you on the road accompanied by Mr. Vincent Pewell I was informed that very night that he took you to his own home. That ends the story." (The story of what he has seen of us till this evening.)

"It is a long promise that I promise to come and spend a little time with you. I heard you are

interested in this Parish"

"Several people told me that you are quite enterprising. (You entertain people) Around two weeks ago I paid Miss Jude a visit. She asked me if I ever pay you a visit. I tell her - no. She said according to how we live I should. For you are quite enterprising living amongst us."
"Thats the matter."

"I came straight from work. I was wet with

sweat I couldnt come to say how do you do!

"One of those nights instructor Hines was here. I am sorry to say - that I feel so mewhat out of place xixxxxxxxxxxxxxx to know that you people ARE who are so energetic live so close to me and I never want pay a visit until to-night. Had you gone away and I didnt pay you a visit I consider that I fail a loss that it turned to a loss. "

"Listen to me. Then it pay that I come to take your time? I have this time to give away at any time. What beat me - I never know that you have

so much work until to-day."

Missionary work. "Teaching Negroes". Thatch Walk.

He realised it only after he met Miss Barrett coming from Thatch Walk to Green Olive. He asked her where she comes from. "From Green Olive" was the an swer, "How can you be from Green Olive? We both met in Thatch Walk. That the back part of the district. where the Negroes are. There we both were interested in those Negoroes - teaching them and making them, From thence MEXING now we become friends. Whie we made meet to-night we were no strangesr with Miss Barret but we were strangers to the others."

"I was a missionary there. I am a Seven Day adventist and I was a missionnary there. From house to house. I was leaving from Eglon Rochester's house going to Charles Heath house and I found her at Charles Heath house sitting comfortably lecturing - doing her work. She was there before me. I could

not tell what she was lecturing."

"Thatch Walk is the back district of Bull - S Savannah. Still include to Bull-Savannah. During the time of slavery the slave was driven to the back part and they still remain there."

"When slavery was abolished they all back to their ancestors property and still stay there and the white and the colour people remain in the front.Because they were higher to them."

Mr. Dyer apologized he was keeping us so long.
"I am telling you too much, I am keeping you out of bed." he himself doesnt sleep much. About 4 hours he says.

"As it come to 4(a.m.) o' clock I must wake and go to the latrine. I canh sleep later. My last son and grandson - they slept in bed. Between

6 and 7 and I must wake them."

He explained that his wife (whom I invited also to come) couldn't come with him as one of them has always to stay at home to take care of the two small grannies. Some other evening Mr. Dyer will stay at home and this will enable his wife to come and visit us.

"I will stay (at home) because I am obedient to her while she is obedient to me. We live it properly. We set good example. Its how we live."

"My grand mother came from Ballards Valley. She was a Scotch. Elliott. And (she) marry at Ball. Val and came to Bull Savannah and live. (there)"

"I was the first lawful grand son and I return to Ballrads Val. and took a wife. I marry a wife, who was Miss Gordon."

Is her family related to the Gordons in Thate

Thatch Walk?

"No separate. (a separate family) Gordon from Thatch Walk - he steal that name - he was a slave. Every black steal his name. Because slave steals master's name. Gordon is a high name."

"John Emanuel Salmon - he lives at Junction - steal the high name of Salmon and he steal his name whilst he was only John Edward. But he stole that name. I knowbecause he was from a very poor family. The person who adopt him and rear him and brought him out to man decently - he steal his name."

Who are the families here, who have their own names - not stolen ones?

"First Rowell same And Fibi they are the oldest Powell. The oldest Dyer - George my great grand-father. He was from Junction accompanied by his brothers: Duncan Holness, Henry Dyer, Joseph Dyer, Samuel Dyer and James Dyer. Those were great grand-uncles of mine. Duncan Holness - he wasnt my great grand uncle. He was another woman's child, but brother to him (to George Dyer). He was a bastard." (Holness).

"And there was an old Rochester raiser from here.
Old Thomas Rochester. My mother's grand-father, who

Elliott to Dorothy Sinclair (Miss Dorothy Elliott
after having married Thomas Sinclair bacame Dorothy
Sinclair). "

" If you look to-morrow through this glass window you will see a great thatch tree. A great grand son is living there by the name of Cornelius

"Miss Jude (Rochester) mother is sister to Cornelius. She (Miss Jude's mother) was Elliott before she married Linton. These Elliott claim themselves to be Scotch people from England. And they were. (This was said with a special stress) Because we witness it. We burried those Scotch in Ballards Val. It's nothing that we heard of, but we burried them. My grandmother Dorothy Sinclair - Missis - was just your quality. Your hair is yellow - her hair was bis black. She was the best woman to live in Bull. Sav. No woman as kind as she. Dorothy Sinclair teach all women to live cor-

"As I tell you Missis Dorothy Sinclair had more children and grandchildren than all women From 4 daughters. (the grandchildren) More than any other woman. She use living on the land she is burried. Just here. You will find there Dorothy Sinclair, Thomas Sinclair, the daughter Judith Elliott on Mr. Laban's premises just here (where) you are living on the land. Ask me the reason why they are burried there. They are burried there because Thomas Sinclair that is burried there and his wife Dorothy Sinclair that is burried there - the home beyond the burrial ground - which is called to-day Mrs. Martha Rochester's home - that is the home of ancient Thomas Rochester which is 'homas Sinclair father -

home. That the reason."

"Thomas Rochester the nephew to the old ancient Thomas Rochester - the father of all."

"The father of Thomas Rochester, Arthur Rochester, Thomas Sinclair and Nicolas Rochester. And Nicolas Rochester is the father of Mr. Laban's home"

"Thomas Sinclair - thats the son -he want to change the name - it was too long. He want to change the name - was going too long. But he (Sinclair) didnt continued because the son die and daughters marry. I was christened Charles McFarlane Dyer. - XI am the first son of the last daughter of Thomas Sinclair and on my father's hand I am the first heir of George Dyer. But it was nothing to heir. I hope to gain heaven."

"Thomas Rochester was the oldest Rochester we can find. Mr. Laban's father was the grat son. Thomas Rochester was the father of Nicolas Rochester who was father of Thomas "ochester who was father of Laban Rochester."

Two women breed. all the people.

"There was two women living in Bull Sav. The name of one of those women was Mistress cennedy and the other was Mistress Francella "ochester. And these two women, two sisters bereed all the people. Those two were great grand mother of my father and my mother and when saying so you, I am 67 years of age and that I can gather to give."

"F ancella ocheser was homas "ochester's mother. When I came to this world Mistress ennedy loose his (her) husband. Grand mother of my grandfather. No Kennedy (left in the district any more). I couldn't describe you what happened to Mennedy. Som of Mrs. Kennedy: Duncan Holtness, James Dyer, Samuel Dyer Jacob Dyer, William Dyer, Susan Holness Henry yer. Thats what I found here and I am giving you Gospel facts."
"George yer had a son dso George Dyer and

I am his grand son and I am now 67 years old so it

is a good time."

Asked about Theodore Holness Mr. Dyer said hexwasxnatxfromvthevHtheasx he was not family to Septimus Holness.

"Miles Holness, Winston Holness, Septimus Holness - they are the sons of Uriah Holness, Uriah Holness is the son of Duncan Holness. Violet Holness, "eath Holness and Joyce Holness - those are the daughters of Uriah. Winston call Ambrose uncle. Theodore is a separate Holness."

"Jane Holness is the mother of Winston, Septy and Miles and the girls. Jane Holness brother

is Ambrose - him died."

"And my one daughter marry a Holness - famiby to Cedrick - whose name (the daughter's husband) is Jonathan - his father's name is Charles Holness. He lives in Leititz Savannah - Jonathan Holness and my daughter Rose."

I wait at the Seven Day Church till 10.30 p.m. She had to carry her home and bear the burden When she went home she carry all the good news of Bull Savannah her old home. he is about to sell her home and bought one acre here from my son, - Vincent Dyer, He married Elsie Holness - James Holness daughter. Jonathan Holness the son of Charles Holness /brother of James Holness father of Elsie Dyer/ Jonathan married my daughter Rose, Rose Dyer. Jonathan is selling his home and land to buy a home from his brother in law incent Dyer. Why? He is not living fine amongst his people, His family is not treating him good and is not treating good his wife. IN Leititz district - Jonathan Holness has several cousins in Bull Savannah. He is selling 4 acres there to buy one acre here - but it is just the same price. The land in ull Savannah is dearer, becau-THY The factory don't count money it weight and Jonathan is a shareholder here"

"L20 for one acre /Jonathan is paying in Bull Savannah to his brother in law/ He would ask L 80 or L100 for one acre but he is buying from his brother in law so he give it for L 20. He is selling there

4 acres and house for L280. He will spend more /on building his new house in B.Saw./ I want to get back my one daughter closer to me. ecause I am getting pretty weak. I am coming to be old."

When you go up Bull Savannah you pass over the most important place bight here."

"If you are not moving in a hurry we can give

you more what you are hunting for."

"You come here the worst time the earth can afford. Nobody to give you a rose, nobody to give you a cabbage, nobody to give you a fruit. we can only give you a face."

"The most I know about you from my grand-on Vincent Powell.We call him Glen. My daughter's son" / It seems that Rose is not the only daughter, perhapthe only lawful one/

"He /she/ is my daughter - Davids wife.

Vincent - he born with me, he go with me and he study with me. One daughter - first child, the first child."

It was almost 11 p.m. and Mr. Dyer rose to go. He stopped however at the door. He preached a farew

well sermon with great fervor:

"I want your soul to be saved, because Christ is calling to me and you. That these souls of ours be saved before Christ come - now brothers and sisters don't be troubled about these things.
