Francis Adopphous.

Francis Adolphous is son of Sarah Francis and late Charlie Francis /for the particulars see FamRec.101/.

His wife, "Lecinda".

His wife was Rosetta Elliott at first, now Rosetta Francis. She is known in Bull Sayannah under the nickname of Lecinda.

Lecinda is older than Adolphous Francis.
They married "long ago".
Before Adolphous Francis married Lecinda, "he was in friendship with a woman, but did not bri bring him in waxks own house" His girl friend was Esmine Rochester -"she was Eglon Rochester sister, but she die."
"Esmine Rochester have a pickney for him.

Mother die and pickney die - both of them go."
Then he married Rosette Elliott.

Rosette Elliott's father was Charlie Elliott her mother was Judith Elliott. Charlie Elliott was Calbert Elliott's father. He lived "right over albert Elliott. But him die a little bat

ecinda's children before before Christmas." she married Adolphous. Percival Dyer, Lecinda's son and Adolphous'step-son.

Lecinda had 5 children altogether: three by three different fathers before she married Adolphous and two by Adolphous.

Her firs child wax is Percival Dyer. He was "her son by Allen Dyer. Allen Dyer was Bradley Dyer's father. He was living just below Eli Sinclair down the road, just down the bottom."

"Percival Dyer was always with his mother.

His father die when he was small."

"Percival Dyer - him schooled in Bull Savannah school. Good brain, could pass better training." He lives now with his mother and his stepfather.

Adonijah Lewis, son of Charles Lewis.

Her next child was by Charles Lewis. "She did have one boy by Charles Lewis in Top Bull Savannah - Adonijah Lewis. Him went away to St. Thomas and him die. Him living with his father before he go."

Edith Powell, daughter by Jospeh Powell.

Then "she have one by Joseph Powell - a girl Joseph Powell - him Mr. Laban brother-in-law". /Jospeh Powell married Zala Rochester/. "She have a girlmby name Edith Powell. The girl in Kingston now. And good-looking girl. She living in Kingston ston with a man, but I dont know the name of the man. She have about two children. She stayin with the man and working out."

Before she went to Kingston, "she was in friendship with John Roy and the parents did nt like it. John Roy was a man that him have lots of children by different woman. Dont keep one. The man - runner, from woman to woman. She went to Kingston alone. Her parents send her to Kingston - to stop the friendship."

Merton Francis, son of Adolphous and Lecinda. His wiss: Vera Bromfield. Their children. Lecinda had with Adolpous two children only.
Boys: Merton and Neville. "Merton Francis is their first child. Then Neville."

Merton is working in the factory, or rather in Tom. Grow. Ass. He is assistant secretary of the Bull Savannah Tom. Growers Association. Gets weekly

salary about 30/- or 40/-.

He is married and lives in his own house built a few years ago /after the Census 1943/

Merton's wife is Vera Bromfield. "Vera Bromfield - her mother was from Bull Savannah. But her mother marry and live in St.Mary. The mother was Bromfield, and was but the man *kanxmathan* / Vera's father/ was "Massa Cak". The man was Bromfield too. She was Vera's mother was Bromfield by her father and she was Bromfield by her husband. Her father was Daniel Bromfield. Martha Bromfield /living in Thatch Walk is Vera's aunt."

Merton -"he was living with Vera Bromfield before him marry. Him have two pickiney with her.

He marry last year in Kingston.

One of his children with Vera is Noldie Francis. At the time of the Census the child was staying with his grandparents. Now Noldie is living with his parents in Mertoh's house. In the meantime they know he has got also a next little girl." Dudley does not know when how old is she and what is her name.

Before he married Vera Bromfield, Merton Francis had another girl friend. "He had a friend - Alga Rochester, James Rochester daughter." They had no children.

Alga Rochester does not stay any more in Bull Savannah. "She married and living in Porus, Clarendon. Him "= hhb/ went to Kingston and him /=she/ marry a man from Kingston. Them moved from Kingston and live now in country, in Porus. She have a sister, two sister in Kingston. And she was mad - went to the asylum. She get run down, get off and nerves - and evrything. She was tearing all on herself and cursing everybody." It was after Merton Francis left her, but Dudley doubts that

this could cause her illness. "At the time she she was in friendship with Arthur Thompson. I dont know whether this was the two men that made her mad. She was with two men at the same time. Plenty of men. She had plenty of men. Two here, one in Kingston. Too much for him /-her/, it mad him /= her/, got on him /= her/ nerves.

Francis Merton, a mostrict.

Deither Dudley nor Bradley know anything dest boy. Most famous of other girl friends of Merton Francis. They think Dong Juans in the dis-his only girl friend before Vera Bromfield was Alga Rochester. There was - to their knowledge - no other girl in his life. They were sceptical about Merton Francis assertions of having six girl friend "at a time". He just bragged. "Him a boy. Nothing to brag yourself over. No pain that. I never know of his six girl friends."

There were only three men in Bull Savannah who were famous of their numerous love adventures. Theywere Burnell Simpson, Dudley's brother; Emanuel Powell, who died a few months ago /last September/;

and John Roy, living now at Ridge.

"You could really believe them if them tell them have six - seven at a time. Them were really bad. But not Merton Francis."

on the verandah floor. He told me Mrs. Francis wasn't in.
She is selling on the road ginger beer and bread. To-day
(Friday afternoon) is the "pay-bill" in the factory so she
went "to collect". Her customers are the people engaged in

The house is a "smart" one. Zinc roof, big verandah. There are two rooms. There is another small building behind - one living room. In the third building a kitchen.

Re age: Mr. Francis said he came from Cuba in April 1930. He stayed in Cuba for 13 years and 5 months. I think these dates can be relied upon. He left Bull-Savannah in 1917; he possibly couldn't have been 14 at that time and father of a child. (Merton Francis, who also by the way gave his age as 27 and san can't be less than 30) Mrs. Lucinda's age was given 46 so she would be in 1917 15. She had before Merton two children alreadyxif two different men. It is highly improbable that at 15 she had already 3 children by 3 different fathers. The age of the child Naldy was given by his mother Vera Francis as 8 years. However in this case asian many others this arithmetic doesn't convince the informants.

Adolphous Francis is the son of harles and Sarah Francis. "This home now belonging to Mr. Windy Elliott was my grandfather's home and land. He sell it and leave the place. The first wife die and the second leave him, so he fret, sold the place to Mr. Windy's father and went to Kingston. He had a cousin there in water police. Got as high as sergeafit. In those days they didn't care for land, he sold the place and leave here." Peter Francis was the brother of Nathaniel Francis father of Stanley Francis(F.R. 87) Adolphous doesn't remember the name of his paternal great grand father, but he knows he used to live in the place where Reggie Rochester lives now. "This place down there where the cricket ground is - it was Francis. The father of my grandfather live there."

His father died while he was in Cuba. The mother is still alive and lives in the neighbouring house.

His wife Lucinda is from the Elliott family (see F.R. 21,45,19610) They knew each other from childhood living in neighbouring houses. They also went to school together: "Joseph Neil was pupil-teacher at the time". He what made him leave the young girl-friend, whom he rejoined after 13 years - I couldn't get.

L3 years in Cuba. " spent 13 years and 5 months in 'uba I still can speak and read Sanish". He went there in 1917 at the time when many people from Jamaica an went there to clear the groundsand work on the prespering sugar plan tations. He liked life in Cuba. I asked him why he returned after such a long sojourn, xVIfxysuxstaxvicevice and whe

ther he brought a lot of savings from there.

"If you stay too long in the sountry - you live like natives, don't remember you have a country to come back, to save." "Like the natives" he would go after a period of work and spend his savings in the city. Later in the twenties the earnings were not good at all "The country go down." Adophous found himself "without house, without land, no family." He decided he will be back to his place. He explained that foreigners couldn't buy land in cuba. "And I have always my mother/at heart." "hile he was in cuba his father died. "She was getting old and me being the oldest - I was the only one really to take care of her." (There were 9 children see p.2&3) which reason was the most important: lack of work or the love for the mother it is difficult to say, but he repeated both several times.

"I write them and send money, but for the last 4 years I didn't write at all, I had nothing to send." His family didn't know what became of him. He came unexpectedly to Bu Bul-Savnnah "And the mother cry". I come back and God bless me." He liked the life in Cuba "I could live there." (Meaning he would like to live there if the economic situation wasbetter.) "The people there good - if you don't trouble them - they don't trouble you". (It is a cliche sentence I heard from almost every one who was in Cuba.) "In every country, in every society you find the good ones and the bad ones, I can live with every one." At times he used to work in places where there were no Jamaicans, but for the majority of time he had some Jamaicans round him.

"Poor people, hard working people."

The children While he were speaking a goat wandered into the garden. Adolphous called "Roxroy Windy's goat in the garden". The young boy emerged from the smaller house and run to chase the goat. Two other boys were in the yard. I said: "You have many helpers - so many boys around." Adolphous sighed: "So many boys, and none for me raise other people's children. I have only two my own." His eldest son Merton Francis was brought up by the mother's parents. "e explained that Royrox Senior was acou

in my

Naldy Francis is his grandson: Merton's child.

Percival Dyer is the son of his wife whom she had with Allen Dyer while Adolphous was away in Cuba. He didn't mention the two children his wife had before zwevhed Merz ton. After Adolphous returned from uba he built his house. He reasumed his friendship with Lucinda. They married in 1937.

Religion fter Roxrog came back from chasing the goat he sat in the open window of the smaller house and was reading "Watch Tower." Adolphous said "I am doing a little reading myself - I subscribe to the society." But he wasn't interested very much in religious matters.

Social problems. Unlike the Jehovah Witness official attitude Francis is interested in social problems: "Take Jamaica - the rich man is keeping the poor down. All level land - that belongs to the rich, we have to struggle in the hills. And even the settlement - the poor can't buy it." He explained that for the very poor who need the land most the settlement terms are too hard. "And they give unsuitable land. In five acres perhaps two acres to cultivate and the rest rocks, rocks and stones."

His land. He himself is not bad off. He wanted rather impress me with his good economic status. "God bless me" He helps his mother "and other people" "since I am in a better possession." He has about 30 acres. The house is built on the family land, of which he has 2 acres. He bought from the settlement in Duff-House two "good" (as far as size is concerned) pieces. In Duff-House however there is a lot of land which can't be used as it is stony. "You say 30 acres, and it is perhaps really half of it"

It was getting rather late and his wife was still collecting her money. All the women who sell on the roads collect their money on Fridays. "Mrs. Francis she collect here, at the factory. Merton's wife - her pay bill is in Alligator Pond." (Vera Francis is Adolphous daughter-in-law. She also sells ginger beer of own production to road workers who are paid on Fridays in Alligator Pond.)

Right at the beginning of our conversation Francis said: "My I ask you a question?" I told him people won't know and understand each other unless they ask questions. "What is your mission?" he asked. After I explained drawing him into conversation. But he wasn't suspitious or unwilling. When I was leaving he said "Now I regret I didn't meet you sooner." and sent greetings for J.O.
