Interview with Clifford Powell.

Clifford is the son of John Powell and Josephine Powell. His parents had three children. His father did not marry his mother. His mother is dead. She died when he was very small, so he was left with his father. He cannot read, "me father never send me xx to school, him use to mek me help him with the cultivation".

His wife is Vera Powell (nee Francis) from Bull Savannah. They are married 6 years, and have 3 children. She is the daughter of Ida Francis, he does not remember his father -in -law's name.

His wife is a dress maker. She sews a simple dress for 1/6 and an up-to-date one for 2/- or 3/- but sometimes she can' even get that far price fa the people won' pay the price".

When he was a boy he went k four times to the sea with his father, but he could not go back because, "fever lay hol' pon me, me couldnt stan' the sea". He plants a little tomato every year, but has to rent land to plant it. He has no land, he lives on his fakks father's land. He is a mason, but he is not getting a lot of jobs, "me work mostly fe meself". He is 30.

Interview with Clifford Powell.

His Living.

Clifford is a mason but he does not work on hid trade all the time, because jobs are very scarce. He cannot depend on his brade alone for a living. Last year he built a little house for thlyn Brooks at Thatch Walk. He worked aboutxfarm four days at 5/- per day.

He worked at the factory too building sheds and bins. Sometimes he worked at for a week and at sometime for a day or two. There were other carpenters, and all could not be employed all the time. Then he had to stop to look after his cultivations. e was paid 5/- per day.

He rears a pig now and then . As one is sold he buy another . To work on his trade here it is very cheap. At other places the price is better . Up in the Manchester Mountains carpenters and masonscharge 10/- per day, "but as we all poor me caan charge more than 5/, for me no like to crush the others".

Heaplants about 4 acre of tomato on his father's land . e does it on partnership . He works on partnership with one man by the name of Coley . "Him a one contingent man dey clear to hell a "Bonny Cleber" (Balaclava) . Coley was a Contingent in the War and the Government has given him the land . Clifford has been cultivating the land for him all the time, about 10 years now .

One year he planted tomato, but since then he has only planted cassava. He does not plant as much to sell but if a neighbour of his has no food and wax asks him if for a shilling worth of food he will try to spare the kepperson either one shilling or two shillings worth, just to help the person. He has about 4 acre of cassave He is not so sure it is 4 acre because, he does not cultivate all in one. It is just a little patch here and there.

He does not rent land from any one else, and he has never worked on partnership with any and one besides his father and Coley.

Discussion about a pig.

During the conversation with Clifford a man by the name of Hubert Stephenson came into the yard . Hubert is from Top Hill . He trades on pigs and other things in Kingston . He goes on Burton's truck to Kingston . He

had /

came to buy a pig from Clifford . Hubert offered Clifford £2. 12. for the pig , Clifford refused to take that amount when he/refused £3. 10. on Saturday to a max man who came to buy the pig . Clifford wants £x £4. 0. 0. "and me must get £4.0.0., for me know max the kind of feeding me gi' him . Me no feed hog a night time, me feed them a morning make them full up . When you feed them a night, a morning when them wake up them flat . But when you feed them a morning i can keep them through the day ".

Hubert would buy the pig if he was going to rear it for £4. O. O., but he cannot pay £4. and then take kk it to Kingston to sell because he will not make any kking thing on it. Clifford does not take the £2. 12. O. that Hubert offered for the pig for money. It is not even "tuppy" (1½d) to me". That can even buy me pickney them a good meal nor a shirt fe meself. Me no call that money.

Hubert gathered up his pocket and held it up to Clifford showing him that he has money, and all that he has in his pocket was pound notes, so he can afford to pay for the pig. But the pig doesnot worth £4. Clifford did not mind what money Hubert has he was not going to sell the pig for less than £4. Hubert not succeeding in getting the pig left the yard.

His House.

He built his house himself out of his own money. His father did not help him to build it. He had a little money from the cassava and tobacco that he cultime -vated and with that money he made his house. It was built after the storm in 1933. After it was finished he went to live in it, but he was still attached to his father's house hold. They provided there for him with what help he st could give.

He got married six years ago and after that he began to live independently from his fabler.

His MMXXXX Trade.

He got his trade from Calbert Elliott, both mason and carpent@r. He used to go out with Calbert to his work. Calbert showed him how every little thing should to be done. Little by little he learned the trade. Calbert did not charge Clifford for what he showed him. It was Calbert who worked on lifford's house.

The house & other buildings

There are two rooms in the house. In the Bed room the bed was neatly made, having on a clean spread. There is also a table with a few books and one or two pictures. In the hall there are two tables, one with glass whales, and the other with a machine. There are about three chairs and on the wall there are a few pictures.

Clifford

The house was built by Bubert about 15 years ago. It is built on his father's land. He does not pay rent tohis father for the land. The house looks very strong and new. All the members of the house hold sleep in the house, except odrick impson, who sleeps at his ewn house, that he years from Jacob Groks.

The kitchen is also a spanish wallzed building, with roof of thatch. The kitchen was closed and nothing of the interior could not be seen. The kitchen was also built by Habert. Clifford.

Clifford Hubert has a catchment that he made for himself, but Vera does not know how much i he spent to make it.

Source of living Clifford

Makert is a Carpentar and Mason . He is also a cultivator . He plants tomato on his father's land , working on partnership with his father , & John Powell.

His father gets a half of the crop when it is reaped . In the woods plants cassava , peas , corn , and yams. He sells his tomato , but not the cassava and other things .

At present he is working on his trade. He is getting a few jobs to make houses. He works at 6/- per day. His wife is a dress maker. She sews a simple dress for 1/-6 or 2/- and a silk dress for 3/- or four shillings. Sometimes she gets a few pieces of work, and sometimes scarcely any

thing to do . When the crop is on she gets more work , than when the crop is off .

Land and possession

Clifford has eight acres of land in the woods that he bought from the Government. He has not finished paying for it, and Vera does not know how he pays for the land. He has that land about six years now. The land is at Durf House, and that is the land he cultivates on. Clifford rears a pig all the time, he does not have any other starks animals.

She went to school, and read to the 4th standard. After school, she went to learn sewing at her aunt oris Francis, her mother's sister. Shem went to sewing for a year, then stopped. On finishing sewing she went to seek work at Mandevlle.

Working out

She got a job at Isabell larke to do domesétés work at 5/-6 per week. he worked Imax for one year. Before she got the job there, her mother got married, and went to live in Mandeville, and she went to live in Mandeville with her mother. While she was there she got the job. Her mother's husband is Wilfred Plummer.

EHer husband - Clifford Powell

She met Clifford in Mandeville, and they became friends. "Him ask me mother fe me and me mother give consent" She stopped working after she met Clifford, and returned to function to live. Coming back to Junction she stayed with her am grand mother Henrietta Francis. Her reason for returning to function was to be nearer to Clifford, so that they would be able to see each other more often.

She got pregnant for Clifford, but neither her mother nor her grand mother did not quarrel, "because him did ask fe me, and promise fe marry me". Plans were made for the marriage, and they were married before the baby was born. *** After her marriage she came to Bull Savannah to live. Her mother gave her a machine fro her wedding present. Clifford was her first boy friend.

Her children

She has three children for her husband. They are all at home, Winston the eldest is just seven years old, and will be starting out to school? after the holidays. The training of the children is left chielly to the mother. The father does not a help very much. When the children are naughty the mother elections chastises, "the father wi' most so spoil them".

At an early age the children are taught to use the chimmey, and to wash themselves up. With the washing up mother has to help, as even a m four year old cannot do it wery well without mother. The children do not hear so easily when they are spoken to. The command has to be repeated before they will obey, and chiefly when it is shouted to them.

Lodrick Simpson

On visiting Vera's yard , Lodrick ; , who is called

"Goban" WAS was not there, but he came in the yard during the Interview. era said " See Goban dey you caan talk to himself". Calling out to Lodrick, he replied, "me tired fe see people dey walk up and down every day dey ask this heap a question, question. Every God day them come say them my dey ask question, and no body na get a God thing out a hit. Me no ha no time fe sit down fe answer nothing". With that he was gone.

Vera/ live/ Lodrick Simpson has his meals at Vera Powell's house, but he does not sleep there. He resides in a house that he rents from Jacob rooks at Thatch Walk. Lodrick is no relative to neither, nor her huaband. He and Clifford Powell, Vera's husband are very good friends. "Them/like brother, the two a them grow together a one house ". Cliffor grew with his father ohn Powell, who is living with Edith Sinclair. Edith Sinclair is Lodrick Simpson's aunt, and Edith took Lodrick when he was a little boy form his mother Alice Sinclair, who is Edith's sister.

Lodrick left his aunt Edith shouse not very long ago. "Me no know wha make him left i' no mus'e convenient fe stay dey ". After he left his aunt s house he asked Vera to prepare his meals for him. Vera consented, so he gives her an amount weekly to provide for him. He does not pay her for doing it. She has been providing for him for eight months.

He lives alone at/kin house/at Thatch Walk .He is paying 5'- per month for the house . He has four children ,
three-by Edith Brooks and one by Sylvina Perkins . Fro For
Edith , they are , Lenord ,Orrett ,and Lebert . Vera does
not remember what is the name of Sylvina's child .

Lodrick waxas and Clifford work on partnership on Clifford's land atD uff House. The crop is divided in xxxx two when it is reaped. Now and then Lodrick gets a little work on the road.
