Family History.

Mother Jane Powell. Father Charles Powell. Mother's parents. Annie and Aaron Rochester. Asked if she knew her mother's mother's mother. "Granny Smmie mother? My mother would have to tell you of that. Perhaps she don' even remember. Father's parents. Georgiana and Benjamin Powell.

Ralph - Ivy's first child that a child by Viccy Thompson. The baby is 6 or 7 months old. Ivy does not remember the baby's name. Ralph is trying to get off to America. He has written his Uncle & father's brother who is in America several times about it. "Sometime him promise to send for him, sometime him don' promise."

Land

Ivy does not know anything about it. She said I should return another day and ask harles.

Water supply.

There are 2 tanks. One built by Charles and the othet - a large one - built by his pather. The water collected in the his own tank cannot be used for drinking purposes. It has too much white lime. It was washed the same day the rain fell. The toher tank does not have a barbecue. The water in it is very dirty.

Charles has about 4 brothers and they have all sold out their portion of land to him. They will not, sell out their "portion of the tank. So him wont fix it." All the same, me have the water to use." This tank is uncovered. Ivy had to call her little boy David away from it.

This interview took place over the wash bowl. Ivy was washing her husband'd trousers. She bought the wash bowl years ago for 2/6. There are hardly any bowls for sale now as the wood to make them is very scarse.

Vernice was adopted 3 years ago/her father diadx Arthur Ebanks died. Her mother Mrs. Isabel Ebanks has 7 child-ren altogether. Mr. Charles said -"The mother have 7 of them, and for that reason a decide to adopt her even though I have 10 of mi own at that time. Miss Ivy she first agree' to adopt the child." This child is from fop Bull Savannah where Miss Ivy was born.

Family History

His mother's mother was christian named Judith. He does not remember what was her surnamen Hisputs father was Charles Elliott. He did not say whether Judith was thea legal wife of Charles. Charles died last year at 90.

His father's nother was Esther Roye. His father's father David Roye. Judith , Charles, Esthe and David were all from Bull Savannah. M

His Lands and cultivations

Mr. Charles generally called uncle C. has 2 different places aside from the XXX land on which his house is built. This is 21 acres.

on the land around the house he plants tobacco, tomatoe yams and congo peas. He did not plant any tomatoes on this limit limit to last year. -last crop. He sells his tobacco at from 1/xx10 6d to 1/- per lb. The last time he sold tobacco was a week ago. He recieved it - per 1b. for

Interview with Charles Roye

He sold about 12/- worth then. He expects to sell about 100 lbs of tobacco by the end of the tobacco reaping if he gets "the season" i.e.-rains. The tobacco plot is covers about 2 square chains.

He has 9 cores in New Forrest and 4 acres just over the way there -jast over the black people way; we call it Thatch walk over there.

His tomato crop of about 2 squares was plant d there this year. Said he -"The crop never bright. We loose some of it because of drought. Howbeit, we get about £20." This amount is the sum he had in hand after he had taken out his planting expenses.

Labour: He employed a "black fellow name' Elliott
Leonard, who with himself and his son Herbert, did the
weeding. Leonard lives in Thatch Walk.

During the last tomato crop Uncle C. also got some money from Leonard to whom he had given a piede of land not measured, to plant tomatoes on the half. He is satisfied with Leonard's handling of the situation, and intends to allow Leonard to work the land again next year. From the Elliott pixt Leonard plot he made a clear profit of £10. He had spent £3. 6/- for mould and seed, and had also given guinea grass.

Means of living

Uncle C's chief means of living is in fishing and planting He does not do the fishing himself. He has 2 boats:

1. "Settler's Queen." This boat is captained by Westley
Ebanks of Top Bull Savannah. Uncle C
has his own fish pots, xkikx Ebanks
also "finds his own fish-pots.

This interview given outside of the Cricket fields terminated because of the failing light. Uncle C. promised to see me again to give me the remainder of the story.



Interview with Mr. Charles Roye re land

Wednesday, May 11,1948.

Ed. F.

Mr. Charles was weeding in histobacco plot of -about 2 square chains and situated on the homesi te land. Some of his children were helping with the weeding. plot of tobacco is the healthiest I have yet seen in this district. The leaves are broad and healthy.

On Land

"We around here usually share the land by will, for all the children, but generally leave the piece with the home on it for the children last son. Sometimes when there is not a will there is trouble because the heir probably not satisfiy. If there is not a will the heir-the first lawful heir from the family can claim the land."

He has 4 acres in Thatch Walk , 9 acres in Manchester, New Forrest, and $2\frac{1}{2}$ acres at the home site. He also has a piece of land "in the woods." This is land left by Mrs. Esther Roye his father's mother, and David Roye his father's father, "for the family."

The land is in the process of being shared up now. There is not will. -"They claim that there is a will, but a don't think that will is lawful, because Mi gtandmother didn't administer on the estate."

To administer on an estate is to make oneself - "lawful owner through some legal prosess and document. land therefore belong to mi father who is the heir."

His father has been away in Costa Rica -"since I was a little kid." Uncle C feels that his father therefore has lattle interest in Jamaica any more and therefore that he Uncle C being his father's eldest son is therefore the heir tof the land.

This piece of land consists of 46 acres and is to be shared wix up among 9 people, as follows: 1. Charles Roye (informant) He is due his fathers share.

2. Mrs. Estelyn Senior, sister. She lives in Ballard'S Valley.

3.Mrs. Coolie Miller a sister. She leves in Red Bank.

4. Isaac Roye, bro. He lives in T.B. Savannah.
5. David Roye now dead, bro. (takker's brother)

6. Wilbert Roye/bro. He lives on the old home site.
7. Percival Roye bro. father's bro.

8. Ida May Sheis a mother's sister, now in Am. 9. Mrs. Miriam Hanson a father's sister. She is in Am.

A number of people are to go down today to decide how the land is to be shared up. Those to goa are:

1. Charles Roye (Informant)
2. John Roye ** Throther father's Brother.
3. Wilbert Roye father's brother.

9.7.48. Interv. with Charles Coye.

I met Charles Roye at Adolphous Francis' home. I had the interview with Francis and was taking notes concerning his family. Charles roye wanted me to take down also his family. (I said previously that all Bull-Savannah people will be put in a book we are writing)

Charles Roye paternal grandfather was Charles Roye. He died very long ago. The wife of David was Esta daughter of old Lionell Simpson - the grandfather of Enoch Simpson "living on opposite hill" (Shaddock Hill)

Esta(Simpson) Byer died a few years ago already during this war, about 6 years ago. She was living in the old home occupied at present by Berty Roye (Charles' uncle).

Charles and Esta Roye had 12 children: Miriam - atxpresen she lives in U.S.A.; Coolie - lives at Portsea; Tousy lives in Ballards Valley; Eva dead; Mimi dead; Isaac Atxenvivy BullxSavaunukyxx Isaac is called Teacher and is a teacher in Westmoreland; David dead; Berty lives in the old home; Love Roye lives in Top Bull Savannah; Percival - I don't know what happened to him; William - Charles' father is in Costa Rica. He used to write to the mother, but since she died there were no letters from him; Ida Mae lives in America.

He also gave me the names of his brothers and sister but these names are already recorded in E.F. interviews.
