"Panton Smith father was old James Smith and mother Adita Smith, she come from Top Hill."

His children.

Panton didnt marry. He "is along" with Doris Banton one of the daughters of old Lucy Rowe. She does not share the house with him. She stays during the day in her mother's house and at night in the house of Mrs. Enigo where she rents a room together with her daughter, son-in-law and their three children. Doris Banton has two children for Panton Smith: Myrtle/Ebanks in the census/ and Alvin Smith - her last child. Alvin is an idiot. The mother attributes this to the fact that when she was expecting this child she looked "at a beast."

"Panton he don't marry a wife. Is along with Doris Banton. He has a Myrtle Smith that stay now in Charles Lewis home as a servant."

Doris Banton had 7 children for 4 different fathers. One of them Herbert was the son of Charles Lewis who took his son. Charles Lewis took also the half-sister of his son Myrtle who is a servant in his home.

"Thompson Herbert and Thompson Glenrick - grand sons of Allan. Living in Panton's house. Both /Herbert and Glenrick/ are for Merlie. Father /of those two boys/ is young Charlie Thompson, brother of David Thompson."

"Ida is Allan daughter living now in her father home."

Land.

"Panton works the land himself. He is not very prosperous. Not so poor. Just ordinary. A cultivator, never /was/ a fisherman."

"Allan has more land than Panton. Panton living in Tad Town in old parents home. The family land separate. One /brother/ living in Tad Town - one /Allan/ living in Top Bull-Savannah."
