An historical exhibition of Waihola & Broadbay is proposed for week prior to weekend celebrations.


1998. The deed of the Trust meets Inland Revenue requirements for the granting of tax exempt charitable donations.

The objectives of the Trust are:


- To enrich the NZ society by promoting cultural and spirtual awareness of Polish heritage in NZ.
