George Murray is the senior of the Murrays family, according to Joseph Murray. George Murray was away and the information about the family history gave Matilda Murray.

The founder of the family was Thomas Murray who came from Westmoreland. He married Susan Gooden who was a relative/ sister or aunt/ of Joe Gooden - father of Mrs. Francis Brissett. His place was where Mrs. Brissett's house stands now. He had 4 sons whose names Matilda remembers. They were: David, William, Samuel and Thomas. The last one was her father. He was married with Eve Finley. Her brother Joe Finley was a "big man" He is dead now but his family is in Kingston and Mandeville. Matilda's daughter goes sometimes to Mandeville to visit this family.

Murrays settled on both sides of the road from the square where the post office is now towards Bottom Warsop. Some of the places were sold e.m.: the place where Mrs. Brissett's house is now and which used to belong to Thomas Murray. The house where constable Butler lives belongs now to Mrs. Brissett who bought it from the Building Society. It was David's Murray who could not finish it and the Build.

Society sold it. Also Stanley Guy bought his site from a Murray. But even now along the right side of the road there are houses of: Joseph Murray, Kenneth Murray, George Murray, Susan Evans / sister of George Murray and daughter of Thomas Murray, Eva Murray. On the other side of the road are houses of: David Murray, then a long strip of land adjacent to the road which belongs to Quentin Murray. Further in a distance from the road is a big house of Emma Murray. This site used to belong to Simian Murray.

Matilda Murray was born in the house where at present her sister Susan Evans lives.

Some of Matilda Murray's relatives went to the USA, but they never write her.

she said her grandfather Thomas Murray "He did not born in Warsop, he come and open the Warsop." "It take time to go all over the family - you must go all over the world". "My family is all over the world scattered". "Some is gone never to return, and leave me alone".
