I dont understand this data. I visited to day and saw an old man and his wife who gave their names as Davie and Margaret Genus and who correspond to this household. But they are certainly not the ages ~~xxx~~ as gives above. David is alert, bright-eyed and mentally active but he looked at least 65. The woman is sick and complaining but looked more 50 than 40.

They told me that there were living in the house now besides the old parents, three adult sons: Herman Genus, Jocelyn Genus and Cyrus (whom I saw and went with on a tour of Allsides) Genus. There were also living there 3 grandchildren: Venice (daughter of Maud ~~xxxx~~ who died 2 years ago and left this child with her parents: she had other children by her husband whom he has and cares for); Herbert who is the child of another daughter, Gwendolyn Genus and Aubrey Barnes; and Noel Rowe who is the child of another daughter, Viola Genus who, lives on Allsides, the father Clifford Rowe being "far away"; and a little girl whom noone knew the name of but whom they called "Miss G" who is the daughter of a son Herman Genus who lives in the home. It was not easy to get the name of her mother so I dropped it as already complicated enough.

Winifred and Herbert Grandison seem to have disappeared. I did not see the C. Data till I returned to write this up).

Land.

1. House and Land: Byehouse and 1/2 acre land belongs to the old man -- David Genas. He bought it about 11 or 12 years ago from Arius Rissett for £8.10. and paid 24/- to have it surveyed. He has the title to it and if I wished to have the exact date he would go out the paper for me when I came again.
2. David Genas had also once 2 acres at Durham but got arrears with his taxes and it was confiscated and sold by the Government. About 8 years ago.
3. Rents 2/3 acres on Allsides close by Wilson Valley. Plants cane, cassava, potatoes and yams. Does not get any to sell as they eat it all. They just grow to eat.

Family History: David Genas' parents were William Genus who came from Pedro and Marian Simpson. He had 5 brothers (3 alive) and 2 sisters (1 alive). He gave me however the name of 2 sisters living later : Francella Genus and Georgiana Genus. Francella lives on New Road.

His children: He and his wife had a large family : Herman, Joscelyn and Cyrus Genus who live with him. Stibelle and Oswald who live on New Road. Gwendolyn who lives in Spaldings; Georgiana who lives here (in the house); Viola in Thompson Twon; Claribel in Greenvale (Man

and Edith in Spring Garden. Another daughter, Eldine, lives in Kingston.

Cyrus Genas was in the yard and I interviewed him and later went with him across the hills to Allsides, where I made a number of contacts with people on bought land (mostly from Ignatius Dixon, whom I also met) who rent on Allsides and live on the bought land in great squalour in grass huts. They have access to the New Road by paths (very muddy) through the neighbouring cultivations.

Cyrus rents $\frac{3}{4}$ acre on Allsides about $\frac{1}{4}$ mile from his father's house. He grows a little cane, potatoes and yams.

Herman and Joscelyn work as labourers. "You cannot get land to rent unless you has them money to buy out a cultivation. No outside lands left and the government wont rent or sell out

I then went with Cyrus for the walk, he grumbling all the time about their poverty. Cyrus admitted to having a child called Hubert who lived with the mother. When I asked the mother's name he said he would take me to her. She proved to be Euphemia Dailey, daughter of Francis Bailey, the blind eye man who ~~xxxxxx~~ was found locked in a room once with Mrs Skean's blind daughter, a young girl, and who was dragged out of the room by the men and beaten for it.
