They live in a thatch house with a floor, and divided into 2 rooms. A grass kitchen is near-by.

I was told later on in the village that Carter Francis is the daughter of John Carter. All the family ~~living~~ are of the Anglican denomination with i] the Census records, with the exception of Dixon Israel, who is described as having ~~no~~ "no religion".

Their property.

Carter Francis and other grown-up ~~members~~ members of the family, are described in the Census as farm labourers. Carter Francis does not figure either in Farm schedule nr2, or in F.Sch.nr.3. This indicates that the family has no property of ~~her~~ their own.

The relationship of Carter Francis and her household to John Carter or to Dixon's family has to be studied.
