Mrs Edith Simpson alone seen. Was in kitchen cooking. We asked her to show us the difference between the different varieties of yams which were planted in her garden and which are now shooting. She identified white, Lucea afro, negro, yellow and showed us some yams heads and a piece of renta and St Vincent. She did not mind leaving her dinner to do this and took us over the garden from end to end.

The Miss Simpson Rebecca P.D. 28 Household 56 was identified as a relative. This is the woman who had 2 children for Brissett, both sons who were adopted by Mrs B. one for Wiltshire and one for an unidentified Mendez. Edith S. described the relationship thus: "She called my granduncle". Work it out!

The grounds are on a slope and the soil heavy clay.
