Therese Brooks lives in a fairly sized house with curtains in the window. I have not entered the house to-day. On the verandah there were two big barrels. Shesaid they were salt-fish barrels and she kept gangoo peas in them, no termites. Next to the house is her kitchen. Half of the rob is gone. She exex is unable to repair it because "can't get nails". The kitschen is a wattle shack with earthen floor. In one exert corner there are big stones where the fire is made. On the fire is a big black iron pot. She paid for it 20 shillings at the chinawoman shop. It costs I sh one pound If the pot weights 25 lbs it costs 25 shillings. There are about 7 or 8 tumblers - tin ones. She bought them at Balaclava 3 d. each. In a corner there was some yam.

The yellow gangoo peas is staple food / in this season/
They make fire twice a day: for breakfast and dinner. In the
evening they ext "a little of something". In the kitchen
there was a big barrel where water is kept. It is not salt
fish barrel - it would not keep water. It is herring barrel.
It is difficult to get wood. If they are caught in the fo-

rest they are tried.
