Housing

Mrs. Miriam Himan was in her gungoo peas field on her rent land in Wilson Valley. She married ~~max~~ a few months ago and lives with her husband in a grass house nearby. The house is newly built. Eva Scotts "A little poor woman she is helping during the day" but she does not sleep in Mrs. Himan's house.

Meals

For "tea" Mrs Himan eats potatoes or buys flour at 6d. for 1 lb. and makes dumplings "Johnny/?/ cakes" they are called.

Family
origin.

Her mother was Lillian Campbell. She is dead. Her husband is from Bottom Worsop.

Land and
cultivation

They rent 1½ acre from "Justice Brisset" The rent is 30 sh. per annum. For 1½ Mrs. Himan pays 37/6.-
On the rent land they have yam, gungoo peas, sweet potatoes and casava. Mr. Brisset does not want them to plant bananas there. Yam is "more prosperous" than cane.

Side
profession.

Mr. Himan is a cultivator. He is also a "music man". It is "a little profession" people ask him to play for dance. He gets for it 2/6, or 3 shillings or 1- / 4 shillings
