" Now they remember him. When t they have communion they send him sometimes a shilling. She would not like to go on the country (poor helief). "e have cultivation and came and bananas. "No like de country -- same as you a pauper." Since him sick things get low ... De house mash up and we cant build -- its just de bare structure. Living in a grass hut. .

I had nine children but "everybody doing fe dem own

work.""Hav fe wait -- whether good or bad."

They have 1 acre around the house. They also rent 15 acres on Allsides .. Their son, Harold Daley/who lives in Bottom Warsop, works on their land.

She has 3 daughters who all live in Kingston .. Only oe child (the son Norman) is married. He lives at Wilson

(Wilson Valley?)

She had three children before her marriage to Poyle ... By Doyle she had :

Norman Doyle (eldest)

James, who works on Allsides.

Jeremiah, who lives in his own house, near here. (Here she pointed back. "We call this Mcclure. (land). All de wite people live up dere dead out. So dem call it McClure. Now it belong to Mr Sil (B). Him buy it from McClure.)

She has two grandchildren whom she "raised". They live with her. One (Geneva Carter) was present at the interview. She is the child of Inez Doyle, her daughter.
