Miss Eda H. has an adopted girl (not daughter in this case) her name is Doris. When Doris was 11 years old her mother died and asked Miss Eda to take care of her daughter. Doris came to Miss Eda's house with a chicken given her by her mother. She was very thrifty, sold the eggs, bought a kid - had many goats, -bought a cow. By this time she married and went to live in Kingston. She came back a week ago with a baby. She left the husband who spent all her money and "wasn't treating her nicely". When living Warsop she asked her brother to take care of the cow. He had to send her half of the revenue from milk and calves. The cow had several calves, but the brother never send Doris any money for them. Only once he sold a calf for £6.-- and sent £3.-- to Doris. But the address was a wrong one and the letter came back to him. He came to Miss Eda and asked her to write Doris that he is sending her £2.-- and for £1.-- he is buying a goat for her. The cow was taken from him by Miss Eda, under the pretext that Doris needs money and wants to sell it. The cow was given to "nurse" to Mr. Grandison.

Now that Doris came back to live in Warsop the goat-business had to be cleared. Doris went to her brother and took her goat. But Mr. Cyril Robinson didn't like this turn of affairs. He followed Doris and was disputing over the goat "using bad language". Some boy "interfered" on his behalf. Doris went to ask help from constable Butler. The business is not settled yet.

Cyril Robinson's father lives in Chudley which is across Hectors River just below Green's Town. He is about 70 years old now. For the last 20 years he has his coffin which hangs over his bed.
