During his life his seld once 1.1/2 acre and another time 3/4 of an acre. "I wanted a little money, was in deep water" "If you sell perhaps you cant buy it again" he says amaica wants badly industry to give people work. The small farmer's work is not remunerative. He says one cant even estimate whether a plantation brings any profit. "One business cant help along itself. Perhaps you sell a pig to help yams, then this yams helps you to buy a pig again, and you have to sell a fewl."
