This is the main source of sorrow to wrs. Carter. The house can't be finished because she hasn't got the money. She has three sons and two daughters. James lives "over Craig" fruel in Warsop, Mabel "down to river with Lewis, one daughter in wingston and the youngest son in kingston. He is the only one who cares for his mother. He works in kingston on a farm. The gave fruel \$33.-- to builta house for the mother, but the building doesn't proceed and she has to live in this hut, where the roof leaks.

wer husband peter Carter died long ago. He was the brother of Johnny Carter. The land wassx where the hut sta nds doesn't not belong to Mrs. Carter, it is Johnny's carter. "Family land". I asked who died first: her husband or her father-in-law. The father in law she told me. Why then the "family land" went all to Johnny Carter and none to your husband? She explained that Johnny Carter had a law suit to get all this land and wax he said no one helpe d him with this law suit - which he won, so the land will be his. He pays the taxes on the land where Mrs. Carter lives. "Ind we help him with the taxes." She believes the law suit was with Arthur Carter, but is not uite sure about it. Her maiden name was Maclean. She was born in "arsop. couldn't get much more from her as about 5 women with children came and interrupted the conversation to beg. one Mrs. Shaw came in a bright red dress and with a 1 month old baby in her arms. She wanted a dress for the baby. T asked her whether it is good for the baby to be with uncovered head in the sun. She said she couldn't afford to buy even that much of material. I told her she had both a handkerchief and a hat on her head. The laughed. The lixon women came, and Miss Lindo / who was away when I passed her house/ All beging. I said I had also a big family and how could I have enough money to help all of them. "give to on e said Mrs. Shaw. To which one - to you? She laughed.

Edilie Carter is MJohnie Carter's Sister in Law, and she lives on the Carter land. Her house was very untidy, and the old iron ed only had a few piecies of rags thrown on it.

Before me husban dead him always tell J.C. to swear off the land that him fe get but him wouldn' fo it . When the man (Husband) see say him almos' fe dead him go to him again and him still wouldn' swear it off, because the man did want to pay his own taxes. I always give J.C. 5/- a year fe taxes but since him sell off all the lan! I stop give him because I dont see what I giving him for. About 4 years ago him take away about 1 stretch an sell it. That piece did really belong to my son. Arnold tell J.C. that him not goin' to pay him any more taxes an him mus' swear off fe him portion as him tell Cousin Johnie that, him cut down all the cane, take it feed him beas' and grind some an sell the lan' to Chinee Thompson. As is Arnold plant the breadfruit tree Thompson say him wouldn' like to deprive me out a it, so f him say if me son would a buy the lan ' him would a sell it to him so Arnold byy the lan back from Thompson, but I don' know how much him pay for it". Emilie does not know how much land she has now.

House: The grass house in which she now lives was erected by her son Egerton, it is very shabby now. The frame of the new wooden if house mentioned on page 1. cost £13/ and the carpenter in charge is Hutchinson from FCraig. £5.19. has already been paid to him so there is still a balance of £7.10 and the house is not half finished. Egerton who is responsible for erecting the house lives in Kingston, he is a soldier "An' them jus' raise him to Corporl" (Note on page 1. she said he was working on a farm). Egerton sent £33 to James his brother to put up house for his mother James who was in the shop business bought lumber sometimes "Him take the money and push on the lumber him buy in job lot pon if me and rob the balance of the money". Egerton give him £4.10. fe buy lumber fe finish one room and himtake the money an no lumber no come yet". Egerton built the / house when he was working at Dr. James in Falmouth. "The two boy say them na work pon the house because me won' live to inherit it"

E/C. said Mabel was married. Children: She has 5 children, Arnold, James., Egerton, Imogene, and Mabel./ Mrs. Lewis (Mabel) '(note on page 1. Emilie said M. was living with Lewis down the river) "Got a stroke so she is sickly". Imogene no keep healt'y because she no have no pickney, Doctor say she won' kwep healt'y unless she have a pickney an she feel that she no wan' have any. She say, if she can' get a man fe mine her so that she can mine me, she rather stay without a man". Keith Carter her fgrand son lives with her but she days she does not have any clothes to send him to school and if he is even sent he will not attend. His father James "Won' give him colthes".

Crops: Corn, yam, potatoes. "No lan' fework, only about a stretch. She also has coffee and bananas, and 2 breadfruit trees. "Sometime I sell one or two bunch a banana".

Clothes: She has 3 cotton dresses. "I don' even have one Kerchief fe tie me head".

Her head was tied with a clean piece of pink material "If me even wan' go over scraig fe find out about the lumber me can' go because me can' go out aroad with this pon me head, it don' look good".

Meals: She has coffee in the morning with a little piece of bread. "Sometime me drink it so" There is no mid-day meal, at night she buys 3d fish, ld sweet oil, and 1 lb. or a lb flour. "Bometime me no have no fish me justu'n roun' the food with the oil, when we have a bunch a banana we can' make it come to perfection we have to cut it down young because hungry jus' lef fe kill we".

Livestock: There is one pig which belongs to her niece in Kingston, it was bought by her youngest son Egerton and he asked her to rear it for her daughter.

Farm implements: i how mid a part of a maschett. With loud laughter she said "I don' shame fe show you ma this is all I sot".

Lumber 1 Bullit tree. "I dian' plant it , it jus' grow so"

Financial assistance: "Sometime Egerton send 10/- sometime When Ina have anyting she send it, if Jmes have food an' me sen' the little boy him wh' sen' it, but Arnold no gi' me not

Madd of grass with wooden floor/by son Egerton Carter 12 years ago. House is now in very very bad condition, a new one has been under consturction since February 1946. Owing to lack of funds the new house is not yet finished.

- C. Furniture: One bed(iron) with board and rags on it. 1 table. There is no kitchen and cooking is done inside the house.
- D. Farm:- Emeline Carter does not have any land of her own, she lives on land belonging to her brother in law Johnie Carter. She has 2 bread fruit trees; about 6 roots of banana, and several plants of congo peas.
- E. Occupations and income: Earned 2/- last week for carrying cane for Ephraim Lewis.
- F. Expenditure: In the morning coffee is taken, nothing at midday and dinner in the evening (1 lb flour for 5½d and 1d oil) This amount is not bought every day. Sometimes she gets dinner from Mrs. Brooks and some times from her daughter Mrs. Lewis Mable. Cash exp. for shop iss 1/3 last week. She receives 10/- a mont from her son Egerton in Kingston, the daughter sends money sometimes.
