This is the "slum" area just beneath the station, on the slope towards the Wilton Valley. Mrs. Brown lives in a grass house with her 8 children. Two were in school, the rest round her, the youngest baby in arms. There is about one stretch of land to the house. She got it from her mother who was Eliza Heinz. Her mother got it from her father in law Lindo. He was the brother of Sarah Lindo, who lives in the next house. Mrs. Brown doesn't consider Miss Lindo as relation. White Wallis is her sister and lives with her. She has a daughter Yuly with Maclean - brother of Charles Maclean who is our "boy". Yuly's father is in Kingston. He does not contribute to the upkeep of the child. Mrs. Brown said Charles doesn't help either. I said "But Charles is only the brother of the father, and he has his own children too." "Only one", said Mrs. Brown. I understood Charles Maclean was expected to help because he had the "lucrative" job with us.

The conversation was rather lame, as Mrs. Brown every second word begged me to give her something for the children: dress, food, or else take two or three children from her. Her sister White came and some other women and all made similar propositions. I told the ladies not to expect from me much. I will bring some sweets for the children. "I'll thank you all the same" said Mrs. Brown.
