Family Origin: Margiana is from St. Elizabeth, parents Mary and James Dunkley "Me and Mrs. Howard Saunders a 3rd Cousins we are near family" Margiana came to Warsop with Martha Dixon her lst Cousin and remained with her until she died "after she dead me have to find meownway" Samuel was born in Warsop "same place here" Mother Sarah Simpson, Father Edward Lewis, Mother's mmother Alvira Brown Mother's Father Edward Simpson.

Land: Samuel told methat he had 2 acres of land, his wife contradicted him then he said "you have to call it 2 acres" His grand mother bought the land, it was afterwards handed this mother, and then to him. His mother sold 1 stretch of the land "but it dont finish pay for, and it dont swear off the person who bought the land - Foster was shot by his son Brother Foster "I dut know his right name" "because him say the father would not give him anything him co vit the father labour and him would not help him work". The boy was sent to prison for life. I found out afterwards that Egbert and Adonijah Rowe/live on a part of the 2 acre plot which he said belonged to him, he also showed me a portion which is pwned by Mrs. Rowe his sister. After asking him about the land again he said "Is not for me one, me wont know how much is mine till it pacify". He does not rent any land. Tax; Samuel pays all the taxes - 15/8 a year "Sur charge just come"

Crops: Banana, cane, "After you pay out for all the contrivance, you dont see what you get, you only say since you have the 2 root make you gind it out". He has 25 roots of yam - yellow and St. Lucian. A little bitter cassava is grown and Margiana uses it to make bammies. There are several breadfruit trees but he only showed I that he planted

Children: Margi had 10 childred 5 dead 5 alive

Ivy Dixon died at 2 months "him would not feed". She
had this child when she was 16. When I asked her about the
father of her child and how she felt when she knew she would
soon become a mother, she laughed and her husband al 10 laughing asaid "Please mam she did only take a chance". She
then told me that she did not tell her mother about it "She

find out for herdelf and she nearly kill me with murderation "The boy look after me, him give me anything I want, and

look a fter the baby till it dead.

"Me cut put fe have the pickney them iff I go to this yam stick is a pickney, if I go to the hoe stick is a pickney so for fear I go and full up the world with bastard mejust married to Mr. Sammie, not because me like the breed".

Legitimate children: Lucilda, 12. I askedher if she was not gld to have this child seeing that she was married, "Me never glad, me no want have no more, if me dd know shat to do me would not have any more. Me go to doctor and ask him how me can stop, and him tell me that me cant pay him, so all me have to do is have out my lot".

Aldan: Died at 2 years. "Just start have fits, the pickney sick Saturday and by Sunday, after Church dismiss him dead. Doctor open him and say him did have worm".

Theophilus, 7, Zephaniah 3, Maisie 4, Alphius 6 months. One child was still born "Him dont have any name".

.Clothes

House: The first house was burnt to wn about one year ago. The present house wasput up by sam, Margie helped to cut the posts. The bed which seemed to benailed to the floor of the hut takes up about half the space of the room, and it was strewn with old cloth and badly toen banana mat. Before the bed, was a piece of thin iron shaped some what like a bow cook inside and a lot of wood ash under it, this Margie said was her stov as the sky can when it rained she had to cook inside as there was no kitch-The house was exceptionally filthy, the floor was not swept for days. I drew Margie's attention to this and she said shehad to go out early and that accounted for the untio room, she promised that it would betidy when I returned the following day. I visited her on \$.7.47. and the room was still in the same condition. I did not see my clothes hanging about, she * showed me a jacket which one of her boys had to put on when it rained. This child was dothen in rags and I saw him at his Aunt - Mrs. Rowe, on several occase ions in the same outfit. They are all nakid.

> Health: Both children and parents looked sick. is fed on black mint tea "Me cant buy milk to feed him and me feed him on my breast too". I asked her why she did not take the baby to the Clinic she said "Me dont takehim becaus him not sick".

> She was preparing the mid day meal of for the famil; which consisted of breadfruits. "I put flort with it some ttimes" Margie very rarely buys saltfish as she does not have eomigh money.

> "One ismine and James Pryce my cousin Livestock: 2 pigs. give me the other little one to raise for me and him, when them will ever turn hog?"

> When Sam is not working on his own land, he does day work for other people, he dgs yam hills at 8/- a 100 (without mid day meal) Margie does weeding. Part of this interview was done at Mrs. Bertha Murray's garden; Margie did some weeding there tofay. The garden takes up a little over astretch of land and she receives 2/- for her work.

Sam's Mother was paralised for a very long time and Margie had to look after her "the same sister there Mrs. Rowe would not even help, one time the mother did go down there to stay and she beg me to come and take her back quick, if I was not caring her you think she would say that, and she was at herown daughter? mehave to clean her like pickney, and now them want turn me off the land, menot coming off, and them same people have goat and them would not even give me a little milk for my baby, Mrs. Rowe tell my husband all sort of things about me. Any time Sammie pick any thing off the place if it even one coconut I say to him is your sister, give her one, but them dont have that good mind for me. You see one house put a road - board house - is one of her daughter live out there, them a big people. Egbert wife dont have a pickney and if is she to give one a my pickney them any thing, them dould a dead. Is only this woman living beside me here, when shecook, she see that me no have it and she would call theppickney them and give them sufthing to eat". "Sam mother asay if him carry any more woman in a the house

"Sam mother asay if him carry a y more woman in a the house beside me him will feel angry in a him grave". "It cost we more than pound to berry her, we have to buy all rum for the grave digger to drink and to wash then face".

House (Part on page 2) Thehouse contained a bed, mortar, stove, a basket of "ginger toe" a block of wood, (very low used as a seat).

Mealtime: I arrived at about 10:00 a.m. and the children were all eating. Margie said they were having "Pot soup" only flour was cooked in it. The sup was in a broken pot, which was placed on the ground, and the children helped themselves, / one used a spoon, the others used small pieces of broken pot, the baby also had its share of the soup. Sometimes 5 or 6 breadfruits were cooked for one meal.

Mrs. Rowe, Samuel's sister told me that Margia na was a wicked woman "she tell lie on her husband say him throw water on her and make himserve 10 days at prison. My daughter in law is a quiet and deasent young woman, not because is mydaughter in law but that same woman tell lie that she see her husband and her together same place in the yard, and my daughter in law beat her up and them go to court. Well, after ward them make up the case as them realise isone family. Police Mendez tell Teressa (daughter in law) that she should move from the land because the woman disgrace her. Is not so the man did stay, you know, is my mother last pickney. First time him and my son go out with £3 to buy shoes, but the wife is not good, she have her own way, and look at them now, you would not even beg them a can of water.

After labing Mrs. Rowe I went to Sam. and Margie. I found Sam, sitting on the ground with his children around him and they were all eating cane. He toldme that he had just ome in from work on his pun land where he dug 4 yam hills. After he had finished eating the cane, he took 4 mangoe from under the grass, he gave two to the pigs and divided the other 2 among the children, cutting them with the maschett. I asked Sam why he did not conitnue working, "Me just come to look on the children, as them mother gone out".

Sam and the children still nakid, I took a look at the house and it was well swept.
