# Interviewed Edith Bent

Family History.

Edith was not born at Thatch Walk. Her mother and herself were living at Alligator Pond. Her mother's father Nicholas Stephenson left 3 acre of land for Florence (Edith's mother) After the father died Florence and her family moved up to Thatch Walk.

Hubert Powell is Lena's child and his father is Decell Powell.

. Children

Edith has to support all her children . Francis asked Edith's mother for her. When she had the first child "people tell him that is not his own." Asked Edith what her mother said when she was pregnant. "After you know a'ready. Beatin' and all with the first one." Edith's mother flogged her when she was pregnant. "After you love a person anything can happen. Through him me stil on the boxong. You know when you young. Himp mash up me life and now me neither get married nor ring." Banton, the father of her last child also treated her badly. "Him never give the child farthin'. Beatrice Powell tell him that the child was not his." Before Edith had the child Banton used to give her money. "After me have the child him jus' draw 'way."

#### Housing.

The house in which Edith and her family now live was erected by Charles Dyen. Her mother gave him £10 to make it "she have to find post, white lime, everything and is this little shanty him give her."

#### Occupation.

Edith takes is washing. Price List: trousers 6d, shirt 6d, Under pant 42d, merino 3d, "Only have to do that to hinder me from lose me character." Her mother works at the factory. ,She cleans the floors and seat of the latrine and picks up paper about the yard. She is receives 2/- a day cooks the sall tot workhene me day to it she spen' for all o' we we and when me got it me spen' " Adina, one of Edith's daughters plaits silver thatch. She buys the thatch @ 9d a dozen and sells the plaited straw @ 6d for a hat. 16 yds. make 1 hat.

Rachael Heathe who I saw in the yard has a wooden leg her face was swollen and she tied it with a white cloth. Rachael is from Alligator Pond. She is cousin to Thomas Heathe (F.R. 73.) and is one of K Edith's Aunts. She has been here for 1 week. "She come up for change of air."

George came in and told us that the Inspector had condemmed Archie's meat. He was not able to say what was wrong with the cow. Edith said "It must be have some disease. Is so you see people get sick, sometime the meat not good."

The children were dressed in rags. They were very bright and cheerful quite unlike the other children I met in the district. Viola kept talking all the time and she called her other sister telling her to come in the house because "the woman" wanted to see her. She told me that her brother George was nearly as tall as the house.

Saturday. 20. 3. 48. I.D.

Edith Bent, her children and Decell Brooks were sitting outsite under a tree. The children as usual were happy and kept on talking all the time. There was noting like restraint among them they spoke very loudly.

#### Dressing.

Lilly saw a woman going to Alligator pond. She said any time she decided to go to the Pond she had to be well dressed. She would have to wear a silk frock, shoes, socks and a hat. She told her mother that she wanted a red and white, or a brown and white shoe

Sylvia had material to make a frock and she wanted it made like mine. Herself and Lilly were trying to copy the style.

#### Factory work.

Asked if they could not get work at the factory.

Edith said she had tried several times but without success. "Them don' want all like we but there. Is only straight hair people get work out there factory."

#### Meals

Asked Decell what dish he liked best. He said he would eat anything at all right now. Without asking Lilly she said she liked rice and peas and stewed beef. She said she was a good cook. Edith went to the road for a while. During her absence Lilly peked a green mango and hid herself in a pit they were until she had finished eating it. She shared the fruit with her younger brother. Asked why she hid herself. She said if her mother found to out she would get a flogging.

Edith was not very bright she said I should call aother day "when I feel more strengthify, then me and you can argue."
