Interview with Mrs. Nicola Rochester. 16.3.48. T.O.

The house is in Green Olive between the houses of Charles, Nicolas and Birdie Rochesters, who are brothers and sister of Joshua.

For family hist, of Joshua see Fam. Rec. 24 of his brother.

Mrs. Nicola's parents are Charles and Rebecca Powell. They live just on the hill in Tad Town. Her mother is from Ballards Valley but Mrs. Nicola doesnt remember the name of her mothers parents.

Mrs. Nicoalalooked very prosperous in her neat dress and big hat as compared with her two sisters in law who were in working dresses and only with a kerchief tied round the head.

Occupation.

The husband was not at home. Mrs. Nicola told me he buys tobacco in the district and sells it in Kingston. This year he doesnt go so often to Kingston as the crop is not to good. This is however balance by a good price for tobacco. Suslly this year he stays ghout 3 weeks at home going around buying tobacco and then travels to Kingston. Joshua unlike his fat her and all his brother wasutxx is not and never was a fisherman.

Children.

"I have 7 children - big children. Two daughters married - one in Mandeville and one in Ballards Valley". The eldest son built his house on the hill. She showed me and introduced her 16 years old son Mackenzie. He works in the facotry. He is a strong boy. Mrs. Nicola is proud of his physical fitness "And he is only in early 16".

Her youngest daughter Merlin - the only one left at present at home, just came from school from for lunch. Nice girl and well clad.

The land.

Mrs. N. cola spoke of their land as if they had a lot. I was astonished to find in the census it is only 7 acres. She said the land in Tad Town where her oldest son settled recently is "her" land. Whether she meant by it that it was given to her by her parents is not clear. I asked her and she said yes, but perhaps she didnt understand the question.

Another piece is round the house. It is her husband's faily land he get from his father.

This land in New Forest is very far "Boys go and cultivate there."

I met for the first time Mr. Joshua Rochester in front of his house. Mrs. Nicole was scraping cassava and he was sitting on logs near her. He is much taller than his two elder brothers Nicolas and Charles and his ziethozvanax way of behaving and speaking is much livelier and "modern" than theirs.

The tobacco "speculator".

He says he travels almost every week to Kingston on truck to sell tobacco which he buys here in the district. "I buy it all around :Ballards Valley, Tryall, Chocolate Hole". He himself cultivates tobacco and there is a nice plot of it wight in front of his house. He says than previously there was a lot of tomatoes cultivated in Bull-Savannah, but now "Everything is given to the salad". He calls scorn fully tomatoes "salad" "but salad". He himself does not a never cultivated tomatoes. "I never touch it. My son cultivates in New Forest. I have lands there."

The tobacco he sells is "half cured". This year the price is good. It is rather more difficult to get it than to sell it. However sometimes he has difficulties in selling too "They give trouble sometimes." He sells it in the market in Kingston.

His vorages to Cuba and work in the tobacco factory.

Mr. Joshua went four times to Cuba. The first time he went in 1917. The last time in 1926. He says he never stayed long in Cuba - from under one year to one year and a half. Some of these expeditions were profitable - some not so much. He went to Cuba in company with other young men from the district. The first time he went with his brother Panton Cohester and with Ernest Powell. Panton Rochester has travelled more: he went not only to Cuba but also to Panama.

Mr. Joshua didn't learn spanish in Cuba, although he spent there over four years, in total. "Only a few words - very little." He didnt work there in the field but in the factories. "I never work at cutting cane, I work in sugar mill and tobacco factory. Cigars. hey have the best cigars in the world.

into the kitchen: there were three big wooden trunck

The house.

one over the other on a kind of wooden construction. I didn't have the opportunity to ask what was stored in these trunks /tobacco?/ The kitchen was full of small children "belonging" to his sister Birdie and his brother Nicolas households.

Behind the kitchen there is a big tank with

a very large, white and clean catchment.

Mrs. Nicola was working at her cassava under a little structure which used to serve as a "house" for rabbits, but where now yams were stored. She had on an elegant hat and a smart dress .

Interv. Mrs. Nicola Rochester at her home. 23.7.48. T.O.

Trs. Nicola was scraping cassava just as she was doing it when I visited her over three months ago. I told her that x whex this and she laughed saying "Cassa" va - we do it half of the life and that's our life." Her husband was away in Kingston on his-tobacco busine ness.

Ronald "is along" with-a girl in Ridge the daughter of Beatrix Sinclair. The girl is called "Doui" They build a shop in Ridge, however Mrs. Nicola couldn'. tell me on what basis this partnership will be carried out.
