Interview with Joseph Spencer.

Dyer . "Me father was Diliah, but me don 'carry his name, it seems like dem did thief me " (that is he is got by one man, and owned on another man). His parents are dead. His wife Ethel is the daughter of Sarah Francis and Charley Francis. Ethel has one day daughter Rebecca Spencer, and Joseph has four, one with his wife and three all others.

He is 67 and his wife is 56. They are married 16 years now. Joseph cannot read "Ptcho them send me one time a school in a one suit, and when that dirty me shame and wouldn't go back ".

When he was 16 he ran away to Clarendon. "Me hear say the place good and me want something fie do, for me parents a couldn't manage me, so me run 'way".

"When me go a Clarendon, me go as comma roumd, no me one though, other boy go to, den any body take we fe stan' with them as yard boy".

He stayed with Mr andMrs Pusey. They treated him well. He stayed with them for a long time. "Me have fe say till me turn man for when you can have pickney you have fe say you a big man ".

One of Mrs Pusey' daughters became pregnant for Joseph. When he found out the firl was expecting a baby for him he came home to Bull Savannah. The girl told her parents that she was expecting a baby for Joseph. That was after Joseph had come home. They did not quarrel, "because me go back go look for them, and me try fe make them love me. The pickney a big man now, dey min' me. Him in America now. Me write to them sometimes."

him mother Eva Russel was in company wid another man name Brown, so/AME name Arthur after him! He does not know where Arthur is, he has never seen him for a long time. "If I meet him on the road I wouldn't even know him that him is me son".

The other son/by Vesta Brown. Joseph could not remember his name so calls him Alexander. He does not know where he is, or what he is doing. "Dem all tun big man now and gone 'bout dem business. Dem no worry with me, and me no worry with dem ".

Cultivation.

I paid another visit to Joseph, and he told me that "according to the health me caan do so much with the cultivation-" .- He plants a little potato, cassava, and french bean. He does not cultivate to sell - only to get as much for the home.

"You mean wha! fe tek ketch a tup? Me fight wx with a pig or a goat, but no all the time . Me caan manage goat, me possession too weak, and a goet is from 10/- to 12/- . Pile dey can manage i' but me caan manage i'".

He would try to work sometimes to help himself if he could get work that is nottoo hard-Maxx "but no gentleman no call youfe gi' you any work".

"Me caan plant tomato because you have fe buymoal, seed, grass, and ga' fe hire some a body fe dig the hole , and fe me pocket caan 'low me fee do that".

His wife cannot work at all , she haw been sick for 16 years , "with her head and weakness a back". She has been to Doctor Mais six times, and cannot get better. She is now under the zare of the Balm; "she sick period a time". Seeing that the wife cannot ket work to help every thing has to come through the little he can do . When he makesa shilling or two he has to save the amount to help to pay his taxes. "If me make i' pass the limitthem them we put more & 'pon i' - level

He has two acres of land - which he bought from Dorothy Sinclair of Bull Savannah.

His house & Garden

His house and his kitchen are in one . One room is used as the house and the other as the kt kitchen. The kitchen was wellswept and looked neat and clean . Max The house could be seen only from without as the door is turned in the opposite direction to the kitchen .

He built his house when he became a young man

"Me know decently fe meself . You start life fe you self, then you want a house fe you self". When one has not father or motherto help himself" you ha' fe try and fight life fe youself - but life tough".

Whatever the crop was it has been reaped. The plants that areleft have all become brown and dry. In working his xxxxx garden he does it allalone. "Me ha' fe ping pong me one for me no have thema money fe hire any body."

His standard of living is very poor. When his crop is finished he has to buy food or bread "that is when me can find a fippence". Now and then he buys a little fresh fish, but it so dear that he cannot manage it all the time. Sometimes he has to buy salt fish or mackerel, and sometimes do without fish altogether, "for two ends caan come together fe ketch the/fish or mackerel."

"That help fe bring on the sickness more fah the body caan care as it whim should ".

His Childhood.

As a boy he grew with his mother for a time. His mother found it hard to support him so she gave him to his grand father William Powell. He grew with his grandfather until he became a big man, "and have understanding".

He went to Clarendon because as a young man he wanted to see what the Island waslike, so he started we out to travel. He did not tell his parents that he was going, but after he went to Clarendon he wrote to his mothertelling her where he was.

His Women Kriends

Eva Russel one of his girl friends is from Thatch Walk, Bull Savannah. Vesta Brown another of his girl friends is from Clarendon. He met Vesta in Clarendon while he was living there. After he came from Clarendon he met Eva.

"Me did love Vesta , but one was sufficient."

Joseph Spencer - son of Diliah Dyer and /Chocolate Hole/ and Rebecca Powell /B.B.S./. He has 4 half-brothers: Dorrel Dyer /Shadock Hill/, Badam Dyer /Junction/, Percy Dyer/Junction/, Cussman Dyer /Junction/, One half sister: Sarah Banton, Thatch Walk / or rather B.S./.
Jospeh Spencer had two outside zhikkrangens sons: one "Mydear ab.39 years old, is in Kingston. Another, Giddel, ab.46 years old, is in U.S.A. Mydear Mydear's mother was Eva Russel from B.S. She died. Giddel's mother is fr Vesta Brown /Clarendon/. In the case of Eva Russell - "death separated" them. From Vesta Brown he "went away".

Ethel Spencer. - is from Bull Savannah. Her father /dead/ ix was Charles Francis, histomether her mother /alive/ is Sarah Francis, living in B.B.S. She has 3 full brothers: in Bull Savannah: Edmond Francisand Adolphous Francis / living besides Sarah Francis/ and in Top Hill: Theophilus Francis. Has also one half brother: Dee Francis, living on the verge of B.B.S. and hatch Walk, near the place of old Rajanciah Renjamin Makk Heath. Only one full sister: Martha Burton, living in Kingston; and one half sister: Alice Swaby, living in Shadock Hill /wwife of William Swaby/.

Joseph Spencer and Ethel Spencer /nee Francis/ have only one child: she is Rebecca Spencer, living now in Thatch Walk. Her c.l. husbnad was William Powell, now dead. She had one son for Willaim Powell: Ivan. He is staying with the mother. Their house is in Thatch Walk.
