her sister. She get injection here and she get it in Kingston. That is why she did not have it. Bereta's house was locked up and the other children were sent to her brother Wilbert Rochester. After leaving the hospital she was not strong enough to go home. She had to stay with Wilbret. "I couldn walk. Them have to arms me up. I use stick till I could cramble about a little."

"This one (Analdo) was sick to', but them hide it from me. Them didn' carry it to doctor, you know, them work on it with them own remedy. When I come from hospital andsee it, I say it not going to live, but I work on it. Bath it, give nourishment, try all kind of things, and now see him here - big man, soon come and work for me.

Bereta's last child

Analdo was born on Christmas day. He is nick named Christmas. His father is John Roy David Roy's cousin. Asked if she loved John. "You see if it was not love I would not have this one" (she Analdo) "I don' want to have any more children."

Childhood.

"I really did not grow with my mother. I was at Manning Home and I went to Southfield school. I was there from childhood xxx until I become a young woman up there. After I leave school, I went back to me mother home. I stayed home till I get married."

When Bereta's husband died, she did not have anyone to help her with the cultivations. "Is really through assistant why I have this one" (Anald) She said before that she had the child through love. "For husband die and leave me with all these children, and I did not have anyone to help me with them. If I don' have any thing in the ground to give them to eat, I don' know what can happen. I can' buy food all the time. Him help me with planting. Up to now him me help me."

Asked if she would get married again. "I don want to married again for I don' want any more children. Them too hard to min'"

Education.

Thelma took the 3rd Jamaica Local slast year and failed. "I tell Thelma that if she don pass this year, I don' know what will happen to her. It hard for me to send them up and down. It cost me what I don' have, and is plenty of them! Enid and Hazett will/be taking the 3rd Jamaica Local this year. Bereta pays £1 per term for each child for the extra lessons.

"Joyce send for Cicely. She say, she going to bring up that one, and train her for her own purpose." Cicely is 12 years old. She is attending Mico practising school and willbe takeng 1st Jamaica Local/in July.

House

Bereta has a large 6 appartment house, including verandah. The roof of part of the house was of shingles, and another part of zinc.

Most of the time, t wwas in the drawing room. The floor was beautifully polished. In obe corner of the room there was a kind of table with 3 shelves. On the top shelf was a vase with a growing "lucky plant" in it. About 4 christmas cards and photographs of some of the children. There was also a photograph of Mrs. Mills, one of the teachers at Central Branch Elementary school. Books:

Books were on the other 2 shelves.: / 2 copies of Tale of Two cities. One for Thelma and the other for her cousin Nora Roy who is now in the hospital with typhoid. 2 copies of Christmas Carol. One for Thelma the other Nora's. Silas Marner, a Bible, Bible Certainties, bought from the Sewenth Day Adventist for 22/-. Bereta said "It just put down so, nobody don' read it." Spanish language guide, David Copperfield. Common faults in writing english, Tales from Hans Anderson, Practical School Method, Tom Brown's school days, Treasurers of English Verse, Our opportunity in the West Indies, Vicar of Wakefield, Little Dorrit, The World - General geography, West Indian Reader - Jamaican Eddition Book 5. The lamp was place on a big table to the other side of the room and the following books were also on the table: Let God be True, purchased from the Jehova's Witnesses for 2/- Bereta said she bought it to get rid of them. The person from whom w she bought it siad she should study it, and ask him to explain what she did not understand. "They do that to get you to join them, but them wont get me." The good Earth, Elementary Algebra, Acts of the Apostles, and an Anglican hymn book. On the inner part of the hymn book cover was written.:

Thelma did the cooking today. Bereta said she had a lot of people to cook for. She cooks all the time for one of her husband's brothers Wilbert Roy. "He is old now, and him don' have anybody to look after him." Wilbert lives across the road. Enid took his lunch to him. Bereta had men working in the fields and she had to send their lunch too.

The meal consisted of bammies, yam, and codfish cooked with green tomatoe. "Still able to get one, one tomatoe."
