Interviewed Cinderella Simpson.

Thursday

"I am like old Cinderella. Cinderella was a bastard and I am a bastard. Only thing she was lucky to get a king and I don' get anybody and I am old now."

One of Cinderella's daughters is married and living at Ballard's Valley. She is now Mrs. Elliott. Cindie (Cinderella) said that the Elliotts "marry one another, them have plenty dummy among them"

"Panton Rochester is my brother. Him is not Rochester him is Simpson. Him and Charles Rochester is brother. My father was along with my mother and while him was having we, him was running a racket with Panton mother. Since Panton get big, me father tell us that we is brother and sister. And that we should live like brother and sister for we getting big and we may meet and love. Still Panton mother was a married woman. Me father never own the child when him was young, but now him tell us about it. Sometime you see dummy come, sometime idiot come, it cause through bad parents. That is what happen at Ballard's Valley, them have plenty dummy - married to one another --.

Family History

Mother Eliza Salmon. Father Ezekiel Simpson. Mother's parents "My grandparents? I don' know a thing about them.

Cinderella and Aaron's children: Michael, Ezekiel, Kenwick, Henricks, Birdie Elliott (nee Rochester) living at Ballard's Valley. Adina Sinclair (nee Rochester) living at Ribbit Town. 5 of Cindie's grand children live in the house with her: Coran Chin, Hermin Chin, Bobsie Cunningham, Alvin and Joe Elliott.

Land.

Cindie owns the $\frac{1}{2}$ acre of land on which her house is built. It was bought from Annie Rochester. Annie is Aaron's mother. "The land buy through her son, so I pay 25/- for it. If it was anybody else would not get it for that. Cindie owns 5 acres at Ribbit Town. "My sister Amanda Rochester, Laban half sister leave it for me. That was my mother old home and she leave it for my sister, and my sister leave it for me. Owns 2 acres at Ruinate. Her father left it ofr her. Aaron has land at Ruinate, Burnet Wood, Ribbit Town "and land around the home." Cindie does not know the acreage.

Who cultivates land? "All the picknie them work it." Coran and Henricks has a tomatoe garden at Ruinate on Cindie's land. These boys are still at school. Coran did not go to school today as he went to "pull cassava" for his grand mother. Caron planted 1,500 tomatoe trees. He made £11.15. from his garden. Last year hemade £20.

Family Record 195.

Asked what he did with the money. "Buy clothes, shoes, and all that." Cindie said "Since tomatoe come in, poor somebody can' buy ~~land~~ Bull Savanah land. One little piece cost hundreds of pounds." Aaron does not plant tomatoes. "Him can' work, leave it to the boys."

Kenrick - Cindie's son made £10 from his garden. He works on his father's land. "The crop was not very good this year, but we thank God for what we have. When my parents time, nobody never know Bull Savanah. Is only since you see the tomatoe start, and the factory build and all that."

Kenric and Corona are not members of the society. They cannot become members until they are 21. "I have to join it now, to get grass to help them." If you have a piece of land, you have to put a part in guinea grass, for without the grass it is no good. "

Cindie's boys also plant cassava and gongo peas. "When you plant the tomatoe you bar row them with sweet cassava. When the tomatoe fail off now, the cassava can get space. You get them in October and November to help out."

"You know Major Moxy did say that in all his travels Bull Savanah people is the most independent. Them don' need to rent land from anybody. Them working on them own dependency."

Main food.

Cindie was preparing the mid day meal for the boys who were at work and the children at school. While taking the cassava from the bag, she said. "This is our supportance - our life -. The time when you find we don't have this, things not working right. The yam is only for a season, is planting time now; the cocoe, as you pull it, it done, but the cassave is our support - strong food. When we can' get mammy, we is like fish out o' water."

"When we going to give it to young baby. We make it get moul'y and then put it out in the sun to dry. It is very nourishing."

Housing.

Cindie was living in a house built on Aaron's land. The house was destroyed by the storm. "We have to stop with neighbour. Some people stopmall in a school house We have to pup up this one quick." The house in which Cindie now lives is built on her own land. The other house built on Aaron's house about 4 years ago "was only built for the convenience of the children." The houses are about 30 yards apart. Aaron, Michael, and Ezekiel ~~(sons)~~ sleep in one house.

Illness.

Three of the children had the fever last year. "I take them off to the doctor, whether the fever was to mount or not, I stop it immediately. Some people don't careful. Typhoid fever is a thing that everything must handle to itself. All the urine must bury."

Sammie Robertson who was digging yam hills for Cindie asked her to send something to him for his cold. She poured 3 teaspoon fulls of a mixture in a small tumbler and sent it to him. The mixture was bought from a travelling salesman. Asked who he was. Cindie looked quite frightened and said "All like him, them can't do him anything, you know, him come from Kingston." Me have me own little home remedy. Boil pear leaf, wild grape and rosemary."

Childhood.

Cindie attended the Bull Savannah school. "Old parents take me out school from me in first book. As me is the last one, me was a pet. Teacher beat me and then take me out school. Them feel teacher must not beat me. Him think him was doing me good, but him hamper me life, for I sorry I can't read. That is why I have to try with my children."

"When I leave school, I was a child, only have to do in the home what me mother teach me. When I get bigger and response for meself, I start buy and sell. I go to market and buy. Is this same bammy, I take raise my children them. Me speculate, sell scellion, tomatoe, bottle, all them thing." Bammies did not do well in the Kingston market. "Sell bammy at inland Town, Christiana, Spalding, Mandeville, all them place."

When Cindie started her selling she had to walk and lead her donkey. "First starting point, then did not know 'bout any truck, but later me drive in it. Life was very hard in my younger days. Since I take the chinee children them, I stop speculate. She was not able to say how old the chinese children were when they came to her.

Chinese.

"Chinee is a race of people, when them get in a family and find them honest and correct, them stay in that family. If one live with me and I am honest, the other chine'e will want to get in tthe same family. Every bit of me sisters de wid chine'e." Cindie stated that all chinese who were boyn in China were married when they were children. "Married without them know.. Is so one of them tell me. Some of them sorry now though." One of Cindie's nieces is now in Hong Kong. Her father's parents are old and he sent her over to take care of them. Cindie likes chinese because "them treat me good. Some

people wonder how I did not take a chine'e.

Courtship.

"I meet Aaron same place here. I don' come from nowhere. We all born right here. We are citizen"

Asked if she had to quarrel with her children. "Never have to quarrel with them. They were well behaving children. The one that have the chine'e children, is me sister send for her and get a job for her with the chine'e ~~man~~ man, and seh fall for him."

"My children never do any outing." Asked what she meant. "Them never go out and work. Them mother peel these nails for them" She showed her nails when she said this. Soeaking of one of her daughters, Cindie said. "She never make herself common, she live up to a deacent life She married a lady and 3 years after that before she fall."

The daughter who has the chinese children is not living with him again. "She differ ~~from~~ the chine'e. She working for herself now. She leave him years now" The children's father supports them.

Labour

Asked how much Sammie was paid for digging yam hills. "I don' exactly pay him. Him was here last year with him niece and I was very nice to him so him promise to give me a day. I give him breakfast and in the evening when him draw off, I will give him little something."

Grand child

Joe, Cindie's grnd son kept pulling at her skirts ~~all the time~~. He did not want to stay with his mother. If he was taken there he cried and told his mother he wanted to return to Cindie. "Is me wean him off him mother breast."

Children's play.

about 3 years old
Part of the time Joe/played at motor car driving. He held an enamel plate in his 2 hands, and kept turning it as the steering wheel. He made sounds to immitate the engine of the car. He went backwards and forwards all the time until he fell. Joe did not cry. His father is a chauffeur.at Ballard's Valley. He owns a car.

Kitchen

The kitchen id of thatch all around. There was a heap of stones in the yard which Cindie said would be used to "spanish wall the ~~in~~ kitchen." She has also cement for the floors. The men are now busy with planting. When the planting season is over they will work on the kitchen.

Buyers- 2 boys from Manchester were buying escellion

from the villagers. They intended to sell it again at Balaclava market. Cindie did not have any escellion to sell. Shortly after these boys left, another came. He was also from Manchester. He sold his goods at the Mandeville market. About 3 or 4 young women passed with baskets. One had a donkey. They were buying tomatos and escellion.

"At this time of the year every day you see them. Buying escellion, tomatoe, anything." Higgler from Kingston usually buy Cindie's grapes. She sells at 1/6 a lb. "out of season" 9d."

Aaron's family history.

Rochesters in ~~Bottom~~^{Top} Bull Savannah are "one family, the same family" as Rochesters in Green Olive. Aaron's father was Aaron Rochester, brother of ~~Simeon~~ and Arthur and Thomas Rochester. Simeon Rochester, son of Thomas Rochester, "was to call them /old Aaron and Artur/ uncle." Aaron's mother was Miss Annie - also from Rochesters family.

Aaron Rochester /the son/ had 2 brothers and 9 sisters. Aaron was the youngest ~~mf~~ of the brothers. The eldest was Henry /died/. The middle brother, James Rochester, is alive - lives nearby in Bottom Bull Savannah ~~towards~~ near to Top Bull Savannah.

Of his sisters 6 are alive, 3 died. Judith married Hubert ~~Elliot~~ Moses Elliott - the house almost next to him; Mehala married Thompson Charlie /the senior/ - so she lives also in vicinity. Fredrica married Thompson Philip /Charlie's brother/ and lives nearby on the other side of the road. Jane married to Tad Town - she is Jane Powell now. Dorothy /Stapple/ married to Tryall; Phanny /Thompson/ was living in Plowden with her husband, but she died. Elvy Ebanks - married to Rad Town - died. Ellen Simpson /married/ is living in Tad Town - "she is bastard, mother of Calbert Dyer".

The land where Aaron Rochester lives was his father's land. He got part of it, other parts passed to his brothers: James and Henry. Aaron's land is 7 acres in one plot around the house, but he has also some out-land. It was not explicitly stated whether this land is his or his son's, Michael. Michael described it as his land.

Family around.

All people living around either belong to his family or are through marriages related to him. His next neighbour was Arnold Rochesser - died a year ago and two of his sons are living there. Arnold Rochester was son of Arthur, his father's brother. So he was his first cousin. ~~His next neighbour~~ Eglon Rochester, his next neighbour, is Herbert Rochester's son and Herbert Rochester was ~~again~~ again one of his father's brothers. So Eglon Rochester is his first cousin. Martha Rochester - who lives nearby - ~~was~~ was married to his late brother ~~Na~~ Henry. Willy Rochester - next to Martha - is Henry's and Martha's son - he is Aaron's nephew. Further up there is the house of James Rochester - his brother. One of his sisters married to Uncle Moses /Judith/ is also one of his neighbours. ~~Another sister~~ Two other sisters married to Charlie and ~~Fredrick~~ Philip Thompsons live not so far from here. Thomas Elliott - next house towards the rock is his

/ Evadne

nephew - he is Judith's son. Furthre down in Bottom Bull Savannah live other sons of Judith's - his nephews. Even ~~Kaxkaxxaxx~~ Euston Powell belongs to the family; his wife is ~~Max~~/Rochester, daughter of Robert Rochester, son of old Arthur Rochester, who emigrated to Brötish Honduras. Powell Cornelius is again brother of Euston, Evadne's husband. "All the family hang aroud."

Aaron's children.

Aaron started to live with Cinderella Simpson over 30 years ago. They had 6 children. The eldest son, ~~xxxx~~ George, died ~~in 1921~~ about 1921. One of the daughters, Lily Rochester, died also. Another daughter, Gertrude, is in Kingston. Birdel married Samuel Elliott in Ballard's Valley. Two sons are with him: Michael, who gave his age 24 and said he was born ~~in~~ 1919, and Ezekiel, who according to Michael is 19 now.

Land, cultivations, occupations.

The land they occupy belongsto the father - it is "family land" - but Michael and his brother - as it was explained to me by Michael - pay \$11 the taxes. Their father is old and does not work much on the land. To-day he was helping to dig stones from the rock - the stones are bought by the Company at a price 8/- for a truckload and for a few last days everybody in Bottom Bull Savannah is busy with breaking, heaping and loading stones.

Michael is a cultivator and so his younger brother Ezekiel. They cultivate together. Last year they planted ab. ~~8000~~ 8000 tomatoes and reaped L60 for it. Therir cultivations are here around the house and in the "Ruinatè", - the land below the factory along the road to Alligator Pond is called so. Part of this place, which was taken a few years ago for cultivations of tomatoes by Major Moxsy, is called also "Leaseland."

They have about 100 yam hills - Mosella, White, Yellow and Tawya. About 1 acre under cassava, 1/2 ac. gungoo peas, 1/4 acre corn and 1/2 ac. red peas.

Michael is also a tanner - works with Claston Rochester. He earned some money from this trade for which he bought 1 cow two years ago and 1 steer 1 year ago. Now he has one milch cow with a heifer and 1 steer. He bought the steer for ~~about~~ L11 - now it could sell for L25, but he waits till Christmas when he will get for it ab. L30. The cow gives him as much as 4-5 quarts of milk daily.

~~xxxxxstee~~ Cows are owned by him - nobody else in the househod has a cow besides him. His brother has a donkey, his father - 2 sheep and 1 goat, his mother - 2 pigs and one or two goats. Also a few fowls.

There is a number of mangoe trees near the house - also some coconuts and bananas.

Michael - his plans. Savings.

Michael is not married as yet - he has however one outside child with a girl whose name is /Lily or Mary/ Lee. The child is with the mother who lives in Thatch Walk. He supports the child - it is a girl 2 years old. From time to time the girl is brought to his place and spends the day with his family. He is not going to marry this girl.

He bought his cattle from the money that was earned from ~~his tannery work~~ tannery. The money he earned from tomato will be used to build his ~~new~~ own house. He used for this purpose already ~~some~~ tomato money earned during the previous seasons. He started to ~~his~~ build his new home a year ago. Built already a kitchen and a tank. Now he is building the house. His nearest neighbour will be Crafton Rochester who is preparing to build his house in the same place - it is so called "Ruinat". In the vicinity - on this part of "Ruinat" which is called Leaseland - Hamelin Lewis built already his house and Lindon Rochester ~~is~~ is building now. A lot of people from Bull Savannah - young men - are going to settle down in this so far uninhabited part of Bull Savannah.

Ezekiel is not going to build his own house - he is the youngest and will take over the old home.

Father and son.

All the time we were sitting together under a mango tree. Michael was chatting with his father from time to time about matters concerning running tasks and recent news. They were looking at the cars running to the wedding at Charlie Thompson's and exchanging their guesses whose is the car and who is coming. ~~There was nothing of~~ There was nothing of subordination and superordination in their behaviour. They acted rather as two good companions. I asked Michael who has taught him his agricultural knowledge - raising the cattle and so on. He picked it from his neighbours. Not from the father. His father was not a cultivator. In his young days he was a fisherman. ~~He raised also mules~~ He raised also mules - at his times mules were sold at 225 and more whereas ~~for~~ a cow could be bought for even 4 or 5 L.

Aaron - he is old and sickly and his memory was not too good - tried to describe me his fishing activities. His description was poor and laconic. He remembers however that at his times Alligator Pond was a ~~thickly~~ thickly populated place. Much bigger and more alive than now. Ships were coming to its harbour, a lot of people and trade. Now Bull Savannah is more densely populated than Alligator Pond. He used also to plant tobacco in his days.

Interview with Miss Cinderella Simpson.

I stopped at Miss Cinderella's yard after I left Aaron and Michael Rochester.

Miss Cinderella greeted me cordially: "what are you bringing me" and she laughed heartily at my answer "a cigarette and myself."

She showed me the kitchen which was in repair when we passed through ~~the yard~~ her yard a couple of days after our arrival to Bull Savannah. The kitchen looked like a new one now - walls ~~pinked~~ painted and a new thatch.

I renewed my memory of her family asking her about the housemates and got detailed answer from her.

Present Household.

Rochester Aaron, once her husband. /He said he is 75, but

Two boys - one "chinese" and another black one were working collecting stones from the field and heaping them along the path. She pintoed to the Chinese boy - and introduced him as her grandson, son of her daughter Gertrude who is in Kingston. I asked about the other boy, the black ~~one~~ one: is he also his granny? "This one is my ~~son~~ child, not my daughter's." At this moment Michael who was present at the conversation discreetly left the place.

She explained that though all the children of the house go to school, only ~~is~~ two girls: Hermine, and Babsy, were sent to-day to attend the lessons. Boys were retained in the house to ~~work~~ carry stones. As the Company is buying the stones right now she ~~preferred~~ thought boys may be useful at this work. The eldest one, Kenrick was breaking stones at the rock about 150 ayrds from the house. Henry and Carren were heaping the stones near the house. ~~Henry and Carren~~ Henry and Carren are of the same age - 13. But carren is only in the 4th standard whereas Henry in the 5th. Hermine is in the 4th too and Babsy in the 1st.

Cinderella's family history.

Cinderella is a bastard child of Eliza Salmon and Ezekiel /Salamon/ Simpson, late husband of Francella Simpson in Shadock Hill. She was born in Ridge, in her mother's place and was brought up by her mother. Her maternal home is the same place at which Agnes Dyer lives now with her daughters and grandchildren. Previously ~~Ridgan~~ Pigeon Rochester, her ~~sister~~ half sister / and half sister of Laban Rochester/ - also a bastard child - used to live there. The place - 5 acres of land and the little house - belongs now to Cindereila Simpson. She burried her mother and so she ~~maxxfuxi~~ claims the land and has full rights to it.

Before she went along with Aaron Rochester she had a child for Joseph Rochester, late husband of Martha Rochester in Green Olive. ~~This child~~ It was - as she emphasized - before Jospheh Rochester married Martha. Martha was a stranger - from Exton. She does not know her original name. Her first child - Adassa - married to James Sinclair and lives now with him in Ribbit Town. /he did not mention that she had also another child for Joseph Rochester, Arton Rochester/.

Cinderella and Aaron.

I asked Cinderella how many years ago she parted from Aaron. She felt a little embarrassed - "cant remeber now". She started to count yeras ~~and dropped the subject~~ but dropped it bursting into laugh. Yes, ~~the next two~~ next two children - after 5 ~~years~~ that she had with Aaron - were for Johny Linton. He was a gay man - liked drinking, li-queurs and so on. She laughed again.

Her children.

She changed the subject speaking about her children. Two boys stay with her. One daughter, Gertrude, is in Kingston. She was with a Chinaman and two of the grannies stay with her. Another daughte(Lily died. She had one child, Bobsy, for a Cunningham, a chauffieur that was with Major Moxsy. Than she had another child for Milward Elliott, son of Uncle Moses: Alvin Elliott stays with them. Lily died when she was giving birth to another child for Milward. She was carried to Black River and died in the hospital. Another daughter, Birdel, married a few years ago Sam Elliott in Ballard's Valley - a white fellow. She pointed proudly to little 3 years old Joseph Elliott, son of Birdel and Sam, looking almost "purily" white: red hairs, white face and freckles. Joseph Elliott came here for a visit. Usually when he comes to his grandmother he stays for 3 weeks or 1 month. His mother is expecting another baby so it suits her to have this boy with them. Besides the boy has little company in his parents' home - here there are other childre with whom he can play.

Household arrangements.

Miss Cinderella explained that though they parted from each other /Aaron and Cinderella/ they still live together - "one family." Aaron has his own living house - this is one room house - ~~in~~ where he sleeps together with his boys: Michael and Ezekiel. But all the day boys are at her place. ~~She~~ They have only one kitchen and she cooks for all of them. It is only at nights that they are separated.

This piece of land where her house is - also one room but fairly big house - is her own. She bought it from "old man mother", Miss Ann. ~~There is a plot~~ The plot is 1/2 acre big. Another piece was bought from Miss Ann by Euston Powell, who again is ~~next~~ related to Rochesters through Jane Rochester, married to Powell, Euston's father, in Tad Town.

Bull Savannah localities.

At the end of our conversation Miss Cinderella gave a short description of Bull Savannah Localities. The place she lives now is "Bottom Bull Savannah". It passes into "Top Bull Savannah" after you pass Thompsons. Bottom Bull Savannah extends further down - Powells in the "overroad" are still in Bottom Bull Savannah. The place she was born is called "Round Ridge". Below it is "Ribbit Town" and up from Ribbit Town and Green Olive "Shallock Hill." She ~~was~~ assured me that the right name is not Shadock Hill, but Shallock Hill /or perhaps Shylock Hill?/.

Dudley Simpson's commentaries.

Dudley Simpson told me what he knew about Cinderella and Aaron. She left Aaron when he was ill - it was about 15 years ago. At that time Johny Linton had a shop in Bull Savannah - where to-day Edith Powell runs her shop. His shop was licenced and a lot of drinking was going on in the shop. Johny had a little room behind the shop where he used to spend nights sometimes even for a week not returning to his home in Dudnedr Hill. He was married at that time but owing to his garçonnere in Bull Savannah ~~was~~ was doing what he liked. Cinderella Simpson used to visit him at the shop and to spend nights in his room. Aaron Rochester knew about this - but could do nothing. He could not blame his wife as he was not married to her. And as long as the woman is not married she is free to do what she likes.
