Went to Cuba 1919; was tepatriated 1931. "I come home for the country was gone to pieces. No money to work. The country becomes pagex hard. The Government as it were, call to the people to leave the country, so the Government would do everything to get you out, whether you have passport or no."

Home coming

When Claston came home he stopped with his brother Charles Roy. He worked on Charles' land until he was able to buy his own. "I pay £16 for 9 acres. That time we did not have tomatoe industry; only confine to tobacco xnd bitter cassava, and gungo peas, and that could not bring money.

Tomatoes & Tobacco.

Claston had about 5,600 plants. Louis and Victor Powell works on his land. "Last year produce more tomatoe, but price go up bett this year and it pay a little better." Tobacco is sold 1/6d a lb.

Length of his life.

Asked him if he believed he would live as long as his grand mother Esther. "Doh' believe I will live so long. I am only 46, and I am so feeble, so I can' live long. I worry a lot. At my age have so many small children. to look after The olace is so hard, that if you even have money to employ labour, you can' bet them. Morning, what I was doing this morning, is against my health, but have to do it - cutt ing grass. I get somebody to carry it but nobody to cut. You know crop time, every body have money.

""Sometime according to what you born under, you have to worry." Saturday I went to the Doctor and him mustbe alaghose my complain, and him say must not worry."

Illness

Claston suffers from high blood pressure. "Dr. advise me not to smoke, according to my complain'. I only smoke a cigarette or two."

Claston looked very weak, He hardly had strength enough to talk. His wife was in bed with fever.

On my way home I met Thelma Kingkaik, she told me that Louis was in trouble last year.

Murder charge.

Sometime in October '47 Louis went to a cricket match at Junction. He had a quarrel with a fellow and and he attempted to cut Louis with a knife. "Louis knock after him, and the knife stall the fellow. So him stab him own self." The boy died before he reached the hospital, and Louis was arrested. "You want hear people cry and fret, every body. Them try him about 3 time, and him get off." Asked if she cried? "Nohk mus', after a me ol' boy frien' Asked if he werenot still the boy friend. "Some sort a fashion."

Louis is the son of Johnson who owns the "George Washington".

Pregnancy and childbirth.

Lettice is usually ill, the first 4 months of pregnancy.

"A sick, a throw up, have fever, not even water a caan take. Some people eat everything." The expectant mother is not supposed to pick anything from a tree. "It will hurt you." She should be careful when grating cassava lest the board "squeeze"the babiy's head. "The greatest hurt is if you get a fall. Or stepping down a hill, you may get a fall jerk, and there will be plenty waist blook in the body. Some day according to the feelings, you just feel to stay in bed; still, you have to come out and work."

Midwifery.

Mrs. Cella Simpson attends Lettice with all her babies.
Margatet Ebanks is also a midwife. "She is not so good,
she can only help if the baby born before Aunty Cella come."
Lettice hesitated before she gave me Margaret's name. "It
really not public. Miss Cella is the right one." Lettice
pays Cella 5/-. "And you know she never take the whole from
me." 3 of her children were born before the nurse arrived.

When the baby is from 1 to 9 days old Lettice takes porridge or a little soup. "A don' take hard food." The baby does not take the mother's milk until it is about 4 days old. The first day is is given warm water "drop a tip a salt in it. The second and third day it is given warm water with a drop of castor oil.

Weaning.

She weans her babies atxxxxxxxx when they are 1 year old.
At 3 months the baby is given thin starch porridge. "Always make 1/2 the cassava get mouldy, then we wash it out and get out the starch.

Children.

The children were very happy. They kept running in and out of the room. They wanted to play "jacks" on the steps. Lettice told them to play on the tomb. She told Dorothy to plait the straw and she would not do it. Shortly after her ball fell in the tank. Lettice said "ThankxGod Alleluia, praise the Lord, if you did do what I tell you that wouldn' happen."

Dorothy and Una were playing. In Suddenly Dorothy started to cry. She told her mother that Una had broken down her marrgold plant. She took up the plant gently and tried to straighten it. Una said "Is she first mash down my roses." The children are now on 5 weeks holdday from school. Lettice liftedx looked up in the roof and Said "A being to beg the Lord fe make the 5 weeks up quick."

Her daughter with the darkest skin, is nicknamed "Black".
