Adassa is able to make her own clothes. "Sewing 'round these parts can' work. -- No money.


### Marriage

The house & Kitchen

Has one room. It is made of spanish wall, with thatch

ed roof. William built his house after the storm in 1932.

He has built it on his own land. The house does not look

very new, but the walls are still firm and strong. All te

the members of the house hold sleep in the house. The house
is not very two large, and it is a wonder to know how it

can accommodate the members of the house hold. He was liv
ing in another house close towhere the new one is, but the

storm blew it down, so he had to build this one. Inside te

the house could be seen two shelves with glass wars wares, to

the shelves was attached what is used as a "safe". A little

table with a xx cover was quite near to the shelves with

glass wares. Nothing else could be seen, as the door was

half closed.

The kitchen is of spanish wall too, but is rather old and parts of it are breaking away. Quite near to the kitchen there is the catchment. That also was made by William.

William is a fisherman and a cultivator. He does his fishing at "lligator Pond. He does not have his own boat, but he uses his brother David Brooks' boat working on parthership with him. He has working with him as hands, James Rochester from Green Olive, Luther Ebanks from Tadd Town, and Nicholas Brooks from Top Bull Savannah. He does not pay them to work with him. Each man has his own pods. The trade pays well, when there is good weather. He goes to is the sea three, or two, or one time for the week, and some times he cannot go at all "when the breeze dey blow".

He plants on his own land 2 acre tomato, 2 acre cassava "me no have not even a hill a yam . Gungoo peas a one a fe we chief crop , we plant i' well enough . You caan put down say me plant 'bout | acre a that " William sells his tomato, the peas and cassava are for his home use. "One a the crop wey we have ya too a the mango crop ".

Keziah , William's wife trades on fish . The buys the fish at Alligator Pond , and sell to the people in Bull Savannah . She goes to Alligator Pond fourx times for the week sometimes one time, when the weather is bad. Keziah was not at home, she was gone to Alligator Pond.

Land & Possessions

The land William is living on is his own. He bought it from Government, when he was a little boy. "Me work the money, and me father buy i'. That time land did cheap me no know how much him pay for i', me only work the money and him pay for i'". The portion is five acres. He has land in the woods too ,"wey me father leave fe all the pickney . We all work the land , i' no divide yet ". He plants on his home land, and the land in the woods . "See me dey clean up place dey now fe plant tomato ! His son William is helping hom to weed the grass . He does not work on partnership with any one .

He has one pig , two gaots , "and one bend foot donkey wey me buy fe £2. . Them other donkey jump up 'pon him and make him foot them sprain , and now them bend and set funny!' (he imitated with his hands , a nd showed the form the donkey's feet ).

# His family History

Alice Brooks his mother dead . His mother came from Fairfield in Manchester .

Charley Brooks his father dead . His father was a citizen of Bull Savannah .

#### His grand-parents

Isabella Gayle his mother's mother . She came from Santa Cruz.

James Brown his mother's father . She was from Montpelier. He does not know his father's parents.

William Grew with his parents . He was sent to school , "sometime me go and sometime me no go . Me stay home catch ground dove (bird) , fat , puss , mangoose , lizard and all kind a other some thing ". He could not say what book he left school

in . "Me never go a school much long , fa we always have fe go hunt fe food up and down and prag . Me go all to Hanover and Little London go buy food . Me know & Green Island , and Orange Bay , and one 'nother place themcall Cave Valley. All dey we go, go hunt food " William started to cultivate at an early age " from me a little boy me dey plant fe meself

Keziah

William's wife Keziah comes from Manchester. Keziah had a child before she and William became friends. Her first child is Vincent Powell, called John Brown as a nick name. Vincent is the son David Powell from Alligator Pond. William could not tell about Keziah's life with David Powell. Keziah and William have been living together for a longtime. They were married one year and two months ago at the Bull Savannah Anglican Church, by the Retd, Immanuel. He does not have any outside children, all hischildren are by Keziah.

The Wedding

The couple walked to church , "we no did bother with any car as a no did far ". The Reception was held at William's yard . He had guests from Kingston , Mandeville , Montego Bay and Spalding , "and a heap a people from Bull Savannah, and plenty children . We did have plenty things fe eat , cake , rice pudding , beef and m food , and bread ". They had five cakes .

Vincent

Keziah's first son is living in a Kingston with his father David Powell. Vincent went to his father when hex was twoyears old. In ingston he is fishing with his father He writes to his mother all the time, and sends presents to her. "Him min' him mother you see, no ask if him min' him"

Edith Brooks

Their daughter has three children for Luther banks from Tadd Town. She and Luther became friends six years ago, but she does not live at Luther's house. Luther supports his children. He is a fisherman, working with William Brooks, Edith's father as a hand. Luther is also a cultivator, cultivating over Tadd own, Edith helps him in his field to weed the grass. Edith trades on fish at Alligator Pond. She goes twice for the week. She provides for Luther, he helps to contribute to the house hold. Edith's father helps to support her still, when it is hard for her. Edith went to school and read to 5th standard.

Is a dress maker. Her father gave her a machine. She does not get"plenty work " to sew, only a little nowand then, and the price is not very encouraging. For the best silk dress she gets 2/- or 2/-6, and 1/- for a print dress. She is supported by her father still, with what help she gets from the work she sews. She went to school and read to

the 5th standard . Adassah deos nothave a boy friend .

Eunice

The daughter that follows Adassah does not live x at her parents'home . She is staying with her uncle David Brooks(see F. R. 187). David is brother to William, Eunice's father . David, who probably is in a better positon asked William to give Eunice tohim . He took her from she was a little girl . David supports Eunice . Sometimes Eunice "come and look fe we , but she never come back to ite live ".

William (junior)
Helps his father in the field . He started three weeks ago to learn the fishing trade, but he stopped to help his father prepare theland for the tomato crop . He was going out with Eric Forbes . He would not mike any other trade "fe wrok in a the dirt a the best trade". William went to school , and did not go any fat x further than the 3rd. standard .

Anita

Helps withthe work of the home, and to help herself she plaits straw and sell. "Sometime them by i' well, but sometime i' no sell at all . The price drops sometimes , and that time she sells at 3d or 31d per 16 yds. When the price is up she gets 41d or 6d per 16 yds. Anita will be going to for an operation shortly "fe cut him 'pendix". Anita's father supports her . She left school in the 6thstandard .

Joyce , eroy, and Vernon Are going to school , Joyce and Leroy are reading inthe 1st standard . The others stay at home .

Children - their behaviour

The children were most boisterous. In playing together they did so in such a rough way . They shouted at each other as if they were not playing together . They did not display what they are taught as good manners . They peeped into the note book, and crowded around in such a way that a few times the/had to be closed . The little girls were like tom-boys riding on two bags with white lime . They were chased off the bags , but did not obey , only laughed and screamed as if that added more fun to what they were having .

The children and bigger sisters looked quite hungry -Joyce who was boiling mangoes, shared the amount the to the others, including father. They all ate the mangoes greedily from the youngest to the eldest. When the children are rude "any body beat them , and them rude , them quarrel withone another and fight one another and do all kind a things "

### Work that the children do

The smaller children, boys and girls, sweep the yard. They also take care of the goats, by moving them and looking feeding for them.

Joyce is learning to tidy the house, making the bed. She takes the chimmey out and washes it. She helps to cleans the house and to wash dishes. The smaller children Correl, Norma, Ferrel can wash them selves up with the help of the bigger ones, but Patricia and Audrey have to be helped.
