"Wood Kankk Lester - he was side man in a truck. No electrician in the power house. Is foolishness that they said you so. He was side man in the company truck "he spent a few year here. He wasnt form Bull Savannah. He was living at first up at Mr. Calbert Elliott home. But afterward he leave and he was along with Linette Miller in Thatch Walk - living in one house. It was the same house as Florence Hanson."

They had no child. But Linette "had one child be before for Stevell Mullings, when she was in Kingston. The child is alive now, here in Bull Savannah. The boy name is Stevell Mullings - he is with the mother."

2. Edna Myrie, Exax(age not given) wife (c.1.)

3. Carmen Wood, about 9; the name of darmen a mether

Born in Moneyfield, "anchoster, Lester first came here when major Moxy began to be interested in the towato. industry. Lester does not r member when that was.

He has no relatives in Full Savannah. He said at first that he lives alone, later that he shares house with his daughter Carnen, and still later that Edna also shares house with him. He has lived ever since his arrival, on the "factory compound. At first he used to live in one of the rooms now being week converted for use as factory office. He was transferred some time ago to one of the rooms behind the co-op shop. He has never paid rent while occupying any of these factory premiums compound rooms.

Provision of his food:

"First time when a come here, the people didn't understand how to give you a little ration to est, so a have to jump round gened miself:" that is, he used to cook for himself. He did that only during offerop times. During crop times he used to have his meals supplied by one of the women who supply food to the factory workers.

His work with the f ctory:

He works and has always worked withing in the factory cannery. During crop time, he runs the "sealer" look after piping and anything go wrong with it, look after power-house if anything go wrong with it, or look after packing house if anything go wrong with it all the same same."

During off-crop times he belps condition machinery for the crop to come.

Bernines:

Initially, he earned 12/- per day. That was with Major Mosy. When another manager waren-Fr. Garter came, his nay was increased to 35/- per week. When Fr. Hasting first arrived lester's pay was increased to 40/- per week.

Interview with Lester Wood.

He has no savings. He has been unable to save because "everything is hard. If a was getting at least a £ 5 a week, a dean sey a wouldn't do a little savin', but to buy clothes, sen' picknie to school, an' feed -1t hard!"

His children:

He has 3 children: 2 of these are on Clarendon, one is shares house with him. Carmen is the child who shares house with him. He did not same the others, nor did he say who their wik nothers as is, or their mothers are. During school-time, Carmen eats lunch at school, but other meals are provided at home by his "housekeeper" Edna Myrie.

Edna

He met Edna 1 year and 2 months ago. She has been sharing house with him akkazhizakimak since.

Desife to cultivate:

He has had no cultivations, buthis now trying to get a piece of land with which to begin planting food-crops.

Lester was found making scinting machinery from the canning factory. Wr. Surke, factory assistant ranger to the Ja. Vegetables Ltd. gave mermission for a brief interview. Lester a tall ruscular man was inclined to be evasive.
