And so it was with great excitement we received an email from the Wellington late last year with the story of a find many Poles will be familiar with. Yvonne from the St Mary's Anglican Church in Silverstream, had been given 4 bottles of

mead for their church garage sale. The mead was labelled and showed it had been made by Wiltod Parowski from Upper Hutt. PHTM was delighted to receive this donation and I am sure this will bring back memories to those who have sampled this great wine and mead makers delights. 2 bottles are dated on the labels by hand 1959 and 1958. Commemorative Sybiracy coin 2 zl

In Poland the term Sybiracy has come to denote all the Poles who were sent in exile to and forced to settle in Siberia from where, some of them did not ever return.

The National Bank of Poland has put into circulation coins commemorating the Siberian exiles, the lost generations of the Polish nation. The 2zl coin was struck in standard finish, in Nordic CuA15n5Sn1 alloy, 28 March 2008.

Coin details, supplied by the National Bank of Poland.
Obverse: The image of the Eagle established as the State emblem of the Republic of Poland. At the sides of the Eagle, the notation of the year of issue 20-08. Below the Eagle, an inscription ZL 2 ZL. In the rim, a semicircular inscription RZECZPOSPOLITA POLSKA, preceded and followed by 6 pearls. The mint's mark MW under the eagle's left leg.
Reverse: The images of human figures silhouetted against the tree trunks. At the bottom, an inscription, SYBIRACY (Siberian

Rim: The inscription NBP repeated 8 times, every second one inverted by 180 degrees, separated by stars.
